RESOLUTION 420107

REDUCE THE COST OF HUNTING LICENSES FOR YOUTH UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN BY CREATING A YOUTH HUNTING LICENSES

THE PROBLEM:

The prohibitive cost of hunting licenses for youth age seventeen and younger.

THE SOLUTION:

Change the current regulation that requires youth age seventeen and younger to pay the full cost of hunting licenses by reducing the cost by half and removal of the stamp requirements. This should be a useful tool in the recruitment and retention of young hunters. Parents would more likely get there children involved in hunting by making it much more affordable sport. Therefore be it resolved, that the Wisconsin Conservation Congress at its annual meeting held in Monroe County supports the creation of youth hunting licenses that would be half the cost of regular hunting licenses and remove the stamp requirement.
