Be it resolved, at the Annual Convention held in 2010, the Conservation Congress, Propose to the Department of Natural Resources that they take action to include a teaching segment in the Wisconsin Hunter Education program, addressing the Conservation Congress role. The teaching segment will address the problem as outlined in points 1 thru 5.

Be it resolved at the Conservation Congress Annual Convention we recommend that the proposal be approved on the floor of the Convention and sent to the DNR for immediate action to implement the Hunters Education curriculum changes.
