

Resolution # 64-02-10

Title: Allow trapping and hunting on state park lands

Concern: Wisconsin has 46 state parks with 75,000 acres and 33 are 600 acres in size or more. There is no trapping, no waterfowl hunting, no bear hunting, no raccoon hunting and no coyote hunting of any kind allowed on state park lands. Presently deer hunting and turkey hunting are very restricted and no small game hunting is allowed.

Whereas, Wisconsin continues to purchase private lands to create additional state parks or expand existing state parks thereby making more areas where hunting and trapping is prohibited,

Be It Resolved that the Conservation Congress at its annual meeting in Vilas County on April 12, 2010, hereby request changing Wisconsin Statute 29.089 to allow hunting and trapping on state park lands and give authority to DNR to regulate this activity according to the wise use of the natural resources.
