

## St. Croix National Scenic Riverway

The Riverway is protected and administered by the National Park Service (NPS). The Totogatic River recently became part of National Scenic status. Currently hunting, fishing, and trapping are still allowed. The Totagatic flows into the Namekagon, which flows into the St. Croix.

In Wisconsin, trapping is not allowed on:

- \* NPS-owned land or adjacent river areas (In Wisconsin, riverfront landowner maintains rights to the centerline of the channel.)
- \* Privately-owned land or adjacent river areas (Unless permission is granted by the landowner).

Trapping in accordance to state law, is allowed on:

- \* Public land along Namekagon and the Wisconsin portion of St. Croix not owned by NPS.
  - \* River area adjacent to public land not owned by NPS, the area of riverbed to center of channel.
  - \* River area adjacent to private land, with landowners permission, the area of riverbed to center of channel.
