

2014 Urban Wildlife Damage Abatement Control Grant Award Summary

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Urban Wildlife Damage Abatement and Control (UWDAC) grant funds are available to urban municipalities for a variety of cost-effective wildlife damage and control measures for white tailed deer and Canada geese. Eligible urban communities can receive a 50% cost share grant up to a maximum grant award of \$5,000. State grant funds available for 2014: \$24,700.
