

SUBJECT: LAND ACQUISITION – QUINCY BLUFF AND WETLANDS NATURAL AREA – ADAMS COUNTY

FOR: SEPTEMBER 2008 BOARD MEETING

SUMMARY: The Department has obtained an option to purchase 240 acres of land from Robert and Judith Dombrowski for \$456,000 for the Quincy Bluff and Wetlands Natural Area in Adams County. The item is being submitted because the purchase price is more than \$150,000.

The parcel is located in west-central Adams County in the Town of Adams about three miles east of the Castle Rock Flowage. The parcel is bordered on three sides by state-owned land and a county highway on the fourth side. The subject is a mix of low wooded ridges and open marshy swales, with jack pine on the ridges. The wetland areas are a combination of sedge and shrub-carr providing good wildlife habitat. There are species of special concern and natural communities present. There is approximately 1/2-mile of frontage along both banks of Duck Creek, a warm water stream that averages five to ten feet in width.

Quincy Bluff and Wetlands Natural Area was established in 1992 to protect a dynamic Central Sands ecosystem composed of an interconnected group of natural communities and their component species. The project contains a vast wetland complex sandwiched between sandstone ridges and buttes and bordered on the north and west by extensive barrens and managed forest. Unique components of the ecosystem include four rare plant species and one animal species listed on the federal Endangered and Threatened Species List. In addition to protection of natural communities and species, the project also provides opportunities for research and education and for public recreation ranging from nature observation to hunting.


Department ownership will consolidate state ownership, prevent incompatible development, allow for natural area management, protect the natural features of the site, and provide opportunities for research, education, and public recreation.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board approve the purchase of 240 acres of land for \$456,000 for the Quincy Bluff and Wetlands Natural Area in Adams County.

2. JUSTIFICATION:

The Department has obtained an option to purchase 240 acres from Robert and Judith Dombrowski for the Quincy Bluff and Wetlands Natural Area in Adams County. The parcel is located in west-central Adams County in the Town of Adams about three miles east of the Castle Rock Flowage. The parcel is surrounded on three sides by state-owned land and a county highway on the fourth side. The subject is a mix of low wooded ridges and open marshy swales. For the most part, the ridges are growing up in jack pine. There is some larger timber in the southwest and northwest portions of the subject. The wetland areas are a combination of sedge and shrub-carr consisting of good wildlife habitat. There are species of special concern and natural communities present. There is approximately ½-mile of frontage along both banks of Duck Creek, a warm water stream that averages five to ten feet in width. There are also some drainage ditches that were constructed throughout the property many years ago although they are no longer

maintained. Ownership of the tract will protect the natural values for future generations, consolidate state ownership, allow natural area management, and provide opportunities for public recreation and natural area history research and education.

Quincy Bluff and Wetlands Natural Area was established in 1992 to protect a dynamic Central Sands ecosystem composed of an interconnected group of natural communities and their component species. The project contains a vast wetland complex sandwiched between sandstone ridges and buttes and bordered on the north and west by extensive barrens and managed forest. Covering the uplands are oak and pine barrens, a xeric forest of mostly Hill's oaks and pines, and small patches of sand prairie. In the wetlands, are both northern and southern sedge meadow, northern wet forest, and shrub-carr. Unique components of the ecosystem include four rare plant species and one animal species listed on the federal Endangered and Threatened Species List. In addition to protection of natural communities and species, the project also provides opportunities for research and education and for public recreation ranging from nature observation to hunting.

Department ownership will consolidate state ownership, prevent incompatible development, allow for natural area management, protect the natural features of the site, and provide opportunities for research, education, and public recreation.



Dombrowski Property



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
