

Retirement Resolution

Donald E Schmitt retired from the Department of Natural Resources on July 30, 2008, after completing more than 14 years of dedicated service to the State of Wisconsin.

Don began his career with the Department on April 24, 1994 as a Limited Term Natural Resource Equipment Operator. He worked in Regional Field Operations as a heavy equipment operator on various fish and habitat improvement projects throughout the West Central Region for his entire Department career. He soon established himself as an excellent equipment operator.

On May 8, 2000, Don became a seasonal heavy equipment operator. Don was recognized by his supervisors and co-workers as a safe and skilled operator of heavy equipment. He became a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources heavy equipment certifier and trainer and passed his knowledge of safe equipment transport on to other employees.

Don did all these things with an easy going, friendly personality that earned him the respect and admiration of his coworkers and customers alike.
