

SUBJECT: LAND EXCHANGE – GREAT RIVER STATE TRAIL– LA CROSSE COUNTY

FOR: DECEMBER 2008 BOARD MEETING

TO BE PRESENTED BY: Richard Steffes

SUMMARY: The Department has an agreement to exchange 0.15-acre of state land valued at \$51,500 for 0.18-acre of land from the City Of Onalaska valued at \$50,000. The item is being submitted because it is a sale of state land valued at more than \$50,000. Since the city is spending additional funds for the project, the land exchange is considered to be of equal value.

This is an exchange based on an MOU between the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and the Department of Transportation (DOT) signed in 1984 when DOT transferred land to DNR for the Great River State Trail. The MOU states that in the event DOT lands conveyed to DNR by the agreement are needed for highway purposes, they may be used by DOT upon provision of satisfactory replacement lands or trail facilities of like kind land and utility by DOT to DNR.

The City of Onalaska and the Department of Transportation will use the DNR land for road improvements near the intersection of STH "35" and Main Street. This 0.15-acre parcel, which is currently being used as parking for the Great River State Trail, will be replaced with a 0.18-acre parcel adjacent to the existing trail parking lot. This is a favorable exchange for the DNR since the City of Onalaska will be building a new tourism center with a trailhead and parking in the general area of the land trade.

The 24-mile Great River State Trail winds its way through the Mississippi River bottomlands north from Onalaska through Trempealeau, Perrot State Park, and the Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge. Built on an abandoned Chicago-Northwestern Railroad line, the trail has a finely crushed limestone surface suitable for walking and bicycling for much of the year and snowmobiling, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing in winter. Trail users find this to be a scenic trail with numerous songbirds and waterfowl in the area.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board approve the exchange of 0.15-acre of department land for 0.18-acre of privately owned land needed for the Great River State Trail.





*This is an even exchange. The Department will be gaining more land and City of Onalaska will be building a new tourism center with a trailhead in the general area of the land trade. In addition, the city's land costs exceed \$100,000 even though its value after removal of the bait shop is only \$50,000.

Location: The land is located La Crosse County in the City of Onalaska about five miles north of the City of La Crosse.

Land Description: The topography of the parcels is level.

Covertime Breakdown: Urban/Developed

2. JUSTIFICATION:

The Department has reached an agreement to exchange 0.15-acre of state land valued at \$51,500 for 0.18-acre of land from the City Of Onalaska and the Department of Transportation valued at \$50,000. This is an exchange based on an MOU between the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and the Department of Transportation (DOT) signed in 1984 when DOT transferred land to DNR for the Great River State Trail. The MOU states that in the event DOT lands conveyed to DNR by the agreement are needed for highway purposes they may be used by DOT upon provision of satisfactory replacement lands or trail facilities of like kind and utility by DOT to DNR.

The City of Onalaska and the Department of Transportation will use the DNR land for road improvements near the intersection of STH "35" and Main Street. This 0.15-acre parcel, which is currently being used as

parking for the Great River State Trail, will be replaced with a 0.18-acre parcel adjacent to existing trail parking lot. This will keep the DNR ownership whole in the area and continue to provide parking for trail users. This is favorable exchange for the Department since the City of Onalaska will be building a new tourism center with a trailhead in the general area of the land trade. This new facility will be available for use by users of the state trail. The 0.18-acre parcel currently is privately owned and used as a bait shop. The city is purchasing that site, removing the structures and, with DOT, replacing DNR's parking lot.

The 24-mile Great River State Trail winds its way through the Mississippi River bottomlands north from Onalaska through Trempealeau, Perrot State Park, and the Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge. Built on an abandoned Chicago-Northwestern Railroad line, the trail has a finely crushed limestone surface suitable for walking and bicycling for much of the year and snowmobiling, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing in winter. The numerous songbirds and waterfowl found in the area make the trail a popular section of the Great Wisconsin Birding and Nature Trail.

The Department recommends the approval of this exchange to allow DOT to reconstruct STH 35 and the Oak Forest Drive intersection near Main Street in the City of Onalaska and to accept the replacement lands that the City of Onalaska is purchasing. The state land is no longer needed for conservation purposes, while the City of Onalaska land will serve as a useful addition for the state trail.
