

**SUBJECT: LAND DONATION - GLACIAL HABITAT RESTORATION - WINNEBAGO COUNTY**

**FOR: DECEMBER 2008 BOARD MEETING**

**SUMMARY:** Pheasants Forever Fox River Valley Chapter offered to donate 49.86 acres of land to the Department for the Glacial Habitat Restoration Area (GHRA) in Winnebago County to the Department.

The parcel is located in the Town of Omro in Winnebago County about one mile north of the City of Omro. Pheasants Forever pursued purchasing the property with a combination of club funds, federal funds, and DNR State stewardship funds as part of a federal NAWCA grant. The parcel was purchased for \$142,000. The parcel includes approximately 4,800 total feet of frontage along both banks of two intermittent streams. The parcel is a mix of cropland, woods and wetland.

The Glacial Habitat Restoration Area was established in 1990 to restore habitat for ring-necked pheasants, waterfowl, and grassland songbirds in Dodge, Fond du Lac, Columbia, and Winnebago Counties. The project uses a landscape scale approach to habitat management that incorporates a patchwork of wetland and grasslands with cropland to create habitat conditions more favorable for self-sustaining wildlife populations in the glacial moraines of east central Wisconsin. The intent is to widely scatter suitable habitat throughout the area, rather than concentrating the habitat in one area. The mix of agricultural land, grasslands, and wetlands is the key to productive wildlife populations. The Department is using perpetual easements, fee title acquisition, other agency programs, volunteer agreements, and cost-share activities with a goal to establish 38,600 acres of grassland nest cover and restore 11,000 acres of wetland within the 24 township project area. The need for the GHRA is based on a documented decline in grassland and wetland wildlife populations. Reductions in habitat quality and quantity because of land use changes have contributed to the decline of grassland nesting wildlife populations. Also, wetland loss or degradation has been an important factor in the decline of many wetland wildlife species. Applying the habitat management practices that restore and enhance grasslands and wetlands will create more favorable conditions for self-sustaining populations of blue-winged teal, mallards, ring-necked pheasants, and non-game grassland birds.

Accepting the gift will allow wildlife management and habitat restoration, which includes plans to restore the croplands to native prairie grass and wildflowers and some small wildlife ponds will be developed in the marsh area. This gift will provide opportunities for public recreation and education including public hunting, hiking, birdwatching, and other non-motorized outdoor recreational activities.





JUSTIFICATION:

The Department proposes to accept a 49.86-acre gift of land from Pheasants Forever. The land is located in the Town of Omro in Winnebago County about one mile north of the City of Omro. The parcel is within the project boundary of the Glacial Habitat project area. Pheasants Forever pursued purchasing the property with a combination of club funds, federal funds, and DNR state Stewardship funds as part of a federal NAWCA grant. The parcel was purchased for \$142,000. There are about 200 acres of state land located 2-1/2 miles to the southeast. The parcel includes approximately 4,800 total feet of frontage along both banks of two intermittent streams. The land cover consists of 38 acres of active croplands, 10 acres of old-growth mixed hardwoods and 1.86 acres of wetland stream bank.



The Glacial Habitat Restoration Area was established in 1990 to restore 38,600 acres of grasslands and 11,000 acres of wetlands to increase populations of ring-necked pheasants, waterfowl, and grassland songbirds in 24 townships in Dodge, Fond du Lac, Columbia, and Winnebago Counties. The project uses a landscape scale approach to habitat management that incorporates a patchwork of wetland and grasslands with cropland to create habitat conditions more favorable for self-sustaining wildlife populations in the glacial moraines of east central Wisconsin. The intent is to widely scatter suitable habitat throughout the area, rather than concentrating the habitat in one area. The mix of agricultural land, grasslands, and wetlands is the key to productive wildlife populations. The Department is using perpetual easements, fee title acquisition, other agency programs, volunteer agreements, and cost-share activities. The need for the GHRA is based on a documented decline in grassland and wetland wildlife populations. Reductions in habitat quality and quantity because of land use changes have contributed to the decline of grassland nesting wildlife populations. Also, wetland loss or degradation has been an important factor in the decline of many wetland wildlife species. This gift will protect the natural, geologic, and cultural values of the property, and provide opportunities for public recreation and education including land use activities of public hunting, hiking, bird watching, and other non-motorized outdoor recreational activities.




