



Retirement Resolution

Margaret A. (Peggy) Beaumier began her career with the Department of Natural Resources on November 19, 1974 as a Typist II in the finance section of the then Lake Michigan District in Green Bay. She held many titles throughout her years in the Finance department before finishing her career as the Regional Finance Supervisor III in the Northeast Region.

After the introduction of WISMART, Margaret created a detailed guide to the Budget Management System for the regional supervisors and in 1999 she was instrumental in the regional training for the new state credit cards. In addition, Margaret created the Finance Guide used to train new employees at the New Employee orientation. Margaret led the Finance Team to host the first regional CAES open house in January, 2006.

Margaret was responsible for the headquarter facility management and budget. She took special interest in energy savings related to building utilities, organization of moving Green Bay staff to a new headquarter building, safety and risk management, and working at the Wisconsin State Fair.

Margaret was an active participant on the hospitality committee for the Governor's Symposium in 1996. She received the employee of the year award in 1997.
