

SUBJECT: LAND ACQUISITION AND PARTIAL DONATION – SOUTH SHORE LAKE SUPERIOR FISH AND WILDLIFE AREA – BAYFIELD COUNTY

FOR: OCTOBER 2008 BOARD MEETING

SUMMARY: The Department has obtained an option to purchase 20 acres of land from Tulowitzky and Ashe for \$84,600 for the South Shore Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area in Bayfield County. The Great Lake Protection Fund is contributing \$46,300 and the landowner is donating \$8,000. The appraised value is \$92,600. The item is being submitted because it involves a partial gift of value.

The parcel, surrounded by state owned lands on four sides, is located in northeast Bayfield County in the Town of Washburn about 10 miles southwest of the Bayfield. The subject has about 1,200 feet of frontage along each bank of Four Mile Creek and is an important and high quality spawning area for Lake Superior run salmonoids and resident brown trout. Acquisition of this property would prevent further development along the river in this area, protect fish and wildlife resources, allow for additional public access to this area of the project and consolidates state ownership.

The South Shore of Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area was created in 1992 to preserve a large, self-sustaining anadromous fishery. The goal of the project is to enhance the stream and coastal habitats to benefit flora and fauna associated with these specific areas. The project also provides public recreation and educational opportunities. Four existing department projects were combined to create this fish and wildlife area. The project spans five distinct stream drainages, including Fish Creek, Cranberry River, Flag River, Sioux River and Pikes Creek, and their associated coastal wetlands. More than 50 percent of the total self-sustaining anadromous fishery on the Wisconsin shore of Lake Superior is associated with the waters within the boundaries of the project.

Purchase of this property will protect fish and wildlife resources and provide opportunities for public recreation such as hunting and fishing as part of the South Shore of Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area. The purchase will also prevent development from occurring and, thus, be advantageous in the ongoing management of this project, and allow for more public access.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board approve the purchase of 20 acres of land for \$84,600 for the South Shore Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area in Bayfield County and accept the donation of \$8,000 in land value.

Location: The property is located in northeast Bayfield County in the Town of Washburn about 10 miles south of the Bayfield.

Land Description: The topography of the land is steep with several ravines and with a level area in the southwestern part of the property.

Stewardship Land Access: This property will be open to the public for all nature-based outdoor recreational activities to include hunting, fishing, trapping and cross-country skiing.

2. JUSTIFICATION:

The Department has obtained an option to purchase 20 acres of land from Tulowitzky and Ashe for \$84,600 for the South Shore Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area in Bayfield County. The Great Lake Protection Fund is contributing \$46,300 and the landowner is donating \$8,000 in land value. The parcel, surrounded by state-owned lands on four sides, is located in northeast Bayfield County in the Town of Washburn about 10 miles south of the Bayfield. The fishery and wildlife value is outstanding. The subject has about 1,200 feet of frontage along each bank of Four Mile Creek, which is a very important and high quality spawning ground for Lake Superior run salmonoids and resident brown trout. Acquisition of this



property would prevent further development along the river in this area, allow for additional public access to this area of the project and consolidates ownership in this project area.

In 1967, the Department acquired a fishing easement on the stream. It provides fishing access on an area 66 feet in width from each bank. Current value was reduced due to the existence of the easement. Fee title purchase provides additional public use such as hunting and will prevent development of the land outside of the easement area.

The South Shore of Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area was created in 1992 to preserve a large, self-sustaining anadromous fishery. The goal of the project is to enhance the stream and coastal habitats to benefit flora and fauna associated with these specific areas. The project also provides public recreation and educational opportunities. Four existing department projects were combined to create this fish and wildlife area. The project spans five distinct stream drainages, including Fish Creek, Cranberry River, Flag River, Sioux River and Pikes Creek, and their associated coastal wetlands. More than 50 percent of the total self-sustaining anadromous fishery on the Wisconsin shore of Lake Superior is included within the boundaries of the project.

The Department recommends purchase of the Tulowitzky and Ashe property to protect fish and wildlife resources and to provide opportunities for public fishing and recreation as part of the South Shore of Lake Superior Fish and Wildlife Area. The purchase will also prevent development from occurring and thus, be advantageous in the ongoing management of this project and allow for more public access to this area of the project.

- 3. FINANCING: Great Lake Protection Fund is contributing \$46,500 and the landowner is donating \$8,000 in land value.
