

Retirement Resolution

WHEREAS, Thomas Dale Pellett has retired from state service in the Department of Natural Resources on April 29, 2005, having provided over 23 years of honorable service and dedication to the people of Wisconsin and to the natural resources of our state.

Tom began his career on June 29, 1981, in Sturgeon Bay as a Natural Resources Supervisor II for northern Lake Michigan fisheries-related activities. After a year and a half in the regional office, Tom relocated to Madison where he served the Fisheries Research Program for the remaining 22 years of his career.

Tom served as the lead investigator on several important research projects including the Baraboo River dam removal study, the Fish Lake project, as well as outstanding fisheries research on the Mississippi and Wisconsin Rivers, particularly his catfish migration study.

In addition, throughout his career, Tom has advanced the profession of fisheries research by mentoring several graduate students and technicians.

The Science Services research team, the Department of Natural Resources, and the State of Wisconsin wish him well on his retirement and his continued enjoyment of the things he loves to do most, including fishing!
