SUBJECT: TREESTANDS & GROUND BLINDS on STATE OWNED LAND

The law now states that you have to haul your treestand or ground blind in on the day you want to hunt and haul it out the same day after you are done hunting on STATE OWNED LAND.

The liability in this for people getting hurt hauling their gear in and out in the dark is tremendous; let alone shooting a deer and getting everything hauled out in the same day.

What about elderly people that are 50 years old or older?

PROPOSAL

Therefore:

- 1) To be able to put your blind or treestand in on the FIRST day of ARCHERY season and remove them the day after GUN DEER SEASON.

Therefore:

- A) Create a permit system that can be incorporated with the purchase of your hunting license.
- B) On your PERMIT and on your BLIND and TREESTAND – (like ice shacks)
YOUR NAME
YOUR ADDRESS
UNIT NUMBER you will have the ground blind or treestand in.
 - 1) CHARGE FOR THE PERMIT

Therefore be it resolved---that the conservation congress at its annual meeting held in MARQUETTE county on April 14, 2014 recommends that the conservation congress and the department work to take action to correct this situation by introducing rule change allowing treestands and ground blinds on state owned land for the duration of hunting seasons.
