

Castle Rock Dam Bow Fishing Changes

The Wisconsin River System below the Castle Rock Dam is currently populated with large amounts of common carp, buffalo, sheepshead and other rough fish. All these species compete for food and destroy habitat for more desirable game and pan fish. Bow fishing is an excellent method to control these species and limit their habitat destruction. A healthier sport fish population is conducive to not only tourism dollars injected into Adams County but more opportunities to allow bow fishermen to be successful.

Be it furthered resolved that the Conservation Congress at its annual meeting held in Adams County on April 11, 2016 recommends a rule change to the Department of Natural Resources to allow bow fishing within 200 feet of the Castle Rock Dam from July 15 until November 1 annually.
