RESOLUTION FOR CLEAR OBJECTIVE LANGUAGE IN RESOLUTIONS /
HEARING QUESTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION

Resolutions are introduced every year at the Wisconsin Conservation Congress annual meetings. Many of the resolutions and questions are confusing, long-winded and deceptive in nature in order to push an agenda. The language of such resolutions and questions posed for review is intentional in creating confusion. Resolutions should be uniform across all counties.

Part I: It is proposed that resolutions submitted and hearing questions be required to use objective and unbiased clear language. Simple sentences are recommended. Language must be used so as not to intentionally cause deception or confusion. Language / questions must be straight-forward and to the point.

Part II: Resolutions should be available for distribution statewide, if submitted before the annual meeting, rather than on an individual county alone while in attendance during the meeting.

Part III: All resolutions should be entered in the permanent record for review as necessary for future reference.

Part IV: Personal street addresses / phone numbers should be optional for posting, but proof of residency (i.e. showing of license) may be required to the delegates.

This resolution proposes the above changes be implemented as policy for the next available meetings.
