This email documents recent discussions regarding the Building 105 Expansion Solid Waste Exemption request for the Tyco Fire Technology Center (FTC) Site (Site) in Marinette. On August 11, 2020, Tyco provided the WDNR with a Request to Manage Materials Under Wis. Admin. Code § NR 718.12(1), to pursue an exemption for on-site storage and management of soils associated with the Building 105 expansion project at the Site. The Building 105 expansion project included construction of a building addition, stormwater detention pond, landscaping, and associated repairs to paved parking and storage lots. Tyco had follow-up discussions with WDNR regarding these soils in November and December 2020, and over the last few months. The soils have been stored in accordance with NR 718.05 requirements, including covering the staged material with plastic sheeting. A representative photograph of the staged soils is attached. The prior planning for these stockpiled soils included consolidation within a permanent on-site soil cover system. As discussed with WDNR during telephone conversations and as presented in the March 15, 2021 Soil Interim Remedial Action Design Report (RADR) for the Site, Tyco will instead send these soils off-site for disposal. While the Interim RADR is under review by WDNR, Tyco will proceed with planning for off-site disposal of these stockpiled soils. Please confirm WDNR's approval to continue on-site storage of these soils.
