Dear Ms. Sellwood:

Thank you for your September 8, 2022 letter regarding the deep wells that Tyco is preparing to install in the Potable Well Sampling Area (PWSA). As we discussed in our call on September 12, 2022, Tyco has already addressed all of the comments raised in your letter as demonstrated in the two reports being submitted to you today.

The submittals detail the studies we have done to design the new, deep wells in a way that will prevent cross-contamination from the upper aquifer. They also include the short-term well testing and long-term monitoring approaches we have planned to ensure residents have safe drinking water.

With respect to our citizen outreach, Tyco has continued to communicate with the residents in the PWSA, even beyond the activities you acknowledged in your letter. As you will see in our submittals, we have engaged extensively, one-on-one with residents about the water options and have shared information on well installation timing and the 20-year water treatment contract that Tyco will fund, including an under-sink kitchen Reverse Osmosis (RO) unit and water softeners and salt.

As you stated in your letter, many neighbors have said they want deep wells. Tyco is happy to have begun the process by mailing out Deep Well Agreements to well owners in the Potable Well Sampling Area (PWSA) who are not located in the area that may seek annexation. Consistent with our open communication with residents, when we mailed the Agreements, we included information explaining how we tested the water in the deep aquifer and confirmed it is a good drinking water source. The mailing also provides information on how deep wells are designed and will be built by Tyco to ensure good quality water today and into the future. The mailing also details the testing that will be done to ensure high quality water. And, it makes

clear that the Agreement does not require citizens to release claims against Tyco related to water quality.

We are grateful for our working relationship with the WDNR and the opportunity to provide the requested information based on studied performed on the deep aquifer to ensure good, clean water can be provided long-term for neighbors who have been very clear about the action they want and have been waiting too long for a long-term solution.
