


# 2016 Wisconsin Bonus Antlerless Deer Tag Information

## Bag Limits

-  Bucks Only
-  Bucks plus antlerless by permit
-  Non-quota Area - No permits issued by DNR
-  Metro Sub-units - Bucks plus antlerless by permit

## Antlerless-only Deer Seasons for 2016

- Statewide 4-day: Dec. 8 - 11
-  Holiday Hunt: Dec. 24 - Jan. 1, 2017

*Limit of one tag per person, per day, until sold out.*

**Monday, August 15 at 10 a.m. - Northern and Central Forest Zones**

**Wednesday, August 17 at 10 a.m. - Southern Farmland Zone**  
**Thursday, August 18 at 10 a.m. - all zones can be purchased**

# Selecting Bonus Antlerless Deer Tags in 2016

*At time of purchase, specify  
Zone, Deer Management Unit and land type (public or private)*

## **Deer Management Zones and Deer Management Units (county):**

The state contains four Deer Management Zones that impact bonus tag availability and deer season structure (see map on page 1). Each of these four zones contains several Deer Management Units (DMUs), most of which can be identified by county boundaries and names. Note that nine DMUs (Adams, Clark, Eau Claire, Jackson, Juneau, Marinette, Monroe, Oconto and Wood) are each split by zone boundaries. Antlerless tag availability may vary between Forest (Zone 1) and Farmland (Zone 2) portions of these DMUs.

**Metro Sub-units:** Six distinct metropolitan sub-units exist around major urban areas and their boundaries are contained within larger DMUs allowing additional hunting opportunities not found in other DMUs. To hunt antlerless deer in one of the metro sub-units, your options are:

1. Select a Farmland Zone antlerless tag(s) for the county in which the metro sub-unit is located.
2. Select a metro sub-unit-specific tag (available in La Crosse, Pierce, St. Croix and Sheboygan counties).
3. Purchase bonus antlerless tags that are specific to that metro sub-unit (available in Brown, Douglas, La Crosse, Pierce and St. Croix counties).

## **Land Type:**

**Public Access and Private Lands:** The Department is attempting to more closely regulate antlerless harvest on public lands in an effort to allow hunters to see more deer and provide a better hunting experience. To accomplish this, all hunters will select antlerless tags based on the type of land they hunt: public access or private. Hunters who wish to pursue antlerless deer on both public access and private land must acquire antlerless tags for each.

**Public Access Land defined:** For the purposes of purchasing and using public land antlerless tags, public land is defined as any land that is open to the public for deer hunting purposes, either by ownership or under lease or contract. Public access lands include:

- Federal, State, County or Municipal, Stewardship and utilities properties open for public deer hunting
- Open Managed Forest Law (MFL) lands designated as open for public deer hunting
- Open Forest Crop Law (FCL) lands designated as open for public deer hunting
- Voluntary Public Access (VPA) lands leased for public deer hunting

**All other lands not listed are considered PRIVATE. You must have permission to hunt on all private lands.**

## **Bonus Antlerless Tags Cost:**

- \$12 each for Wisconsin residents and certain qualified non-residents (visit [dnr.wi.gov](http://dnr.wi.gov) and search "military" for additional information)
- \$20 each for non-residents
- \$5 each for ages 10–11 years

**Limits:** Hunters may purchase one bonus tag per day, where available, until the unit is sold out or until the hunting season ends.

# General Deer Season Information

## Tagging Your Deer

With the Department's new Go Wild licensing system, hunters will now use plain paper carcass tags, which necessitated some changes to tagging requirements:

- Only a single copy of any carcass tag may be possessed while afield.
- After harvesting a deer, the tag must be immediately validated by recording, in writing, the date and time of harvest.
- Attaching the carcass tag to the animal is not required unless the deer is left unattended.
- The validated carcass tag must be kept intact and in legible condition. Plastic baggies are suggested when attaching the tag to the deer.

## Harvest Registration

Electronic registration (GameReg) allows hunters to fulfill the requirements of registering their deer using the phone or Internet, making this task fast, easy and convenient.

**How it works:** Hunters will have several options for registering their harvests.

- 1) **Online (easiest and fastest):** On a computer or mobile device, go to [gamereg.wi.gov](http://gamereg.wi.gov) and enter your harvest information.
- 2) **Phone:** Dial 1-844-426-3734 (1-844-GAME-REG) and follow the prompts to provide harvest information.
- 3) **In person:** Visit a designated walk-in registration station that offers a phone or computer to hunters for the purpose of registering your deer. Hunters may refer to the list of walk-in registration stations which will be available prior to the start of the fall hunting seasons at [dnr.wi.gov](http://dnr.wi.gov), keyword "registration stations".

## Testing Your Deer for CWD

CWD testing is available to all hunters and is voluntary in 2016. For more information on CWD and how to get your deer tested, visit [dnr.wi.gov](http://dnr.wi.gov) and search keywords "CWD" and "CWD sampling."

## Harvest Registration is NOT an Option!

- Registration of all harvested deer continues to be **mandatory** in Wisconsin. It is the responsibility of the individual hunter to ensure the deer they harvest is legally registered.
- All deer must be registered by **5 p.m. the day after the animal was recovered.**
- Hunters will receive a 10-character confirmation number that must be written on the validated carcass tag. This signifies to a conservation warden, wildlife biologist or meat processor that the animal has been properly registered.
- The carcass tag with confirmation number written on it must be retained by the hunter until the meat is consumed.
