



BONUS ANTLERLESS DEER TAGS


FIRST 3 DAYS OF SALE ARE ZONE-SPECIFIC:

Monday, August 15 at 10 a.m. - Northern and Central Forest Zones

Tuesday, August 16 at 10 a.m. - Central Farmland Zone

Wednesday, August 17 at 10 a.m. - Southern Farmland Zone

Thursday, August 18 at 10 a.m. - All remaining bonus tags can be purchased until sold out or the season ends



\$12 - Wisconsin resident

\$20 - Non-resident

\$5 - Youths age 10 & 11

- Bonus tag levels are set based on Deer Management Unit (DMU) and land type (public or private).
- Bonus tag availability will be listed online and at the license agent. If not listed, tags are not available or sold out.
- Customer must be present to purchase a bonus tag with the exception of parents or legal guardians purchasing for children under the age of 18.
- Bonus tags can be purchased at a rate of one per day, per person.

You will need to answer up to three questions when you purchase a bonus tag:

- 1.) WHICH COUNTY DO YOU WANT A TAG FOR?
- 2.) IF THE COUNTY HAS MORE THAN ONE ZONE TYPE (FARMLAND AND FOREST), YOU WILL ALSO BE ASKED WHICH ZONE YOU WANT THE TAG FOR.
- 3.) IS THIS TAG FOR PUBLIC* OR PRIVATE LAND?

**In general, PUBLIC LANDS include federal, state, county or municipal government and public utility lands open to public hunting that is owned, under easement or leased; land purchased by Stewardship funds, all Managed Forest Law (MFL), Forest Crop Law (FCL) or Voluntary Public Access (VPA) lands that are open to public hunting. All other lands not listed are considered PRIVATE. See 2016 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations for a Complete Definition.*
