

Dear Senators and Representatives,

Pursuant to s. 23.0916(6), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources submits this *Report to the Wisconsin Legislature: Properties Purchased with Funds from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program on which one or More Nature-Based Outdoor Activities (NBOA) Is Prohibited*. This report covers the period July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2011.

During the 2 years covered by this report, total acres acquired for public recreation and habitat preservation through the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program and acres with NBOA prohibitions are as follows:



## BACKGROUND

The Wisconsin Legislature created the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program in 1989 to preserve valuable natural areas and wildlife habitat, protect water quality and fisheries, and expand opportunities for outdoor recreation. The Stewardship Program is named for two of Wisconsin's most revered conservation leaders, Warren Knowles (Governor 1965-1971) and Gaylord Nelson (Governor 1959-1963, U.S. Senator 1964-1981).

After 10 successful years, the Wisconsin Legislature reauthorized the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program in 1999 for an additional 10 years. The 2007-2009 Biennial Budget act (2007 Wis. Act 20; see pp. 280-287 of Act) reauthorized the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program for a third decade – until June 30, 2020. This report satisfies the reporting requirement stated in s. 23.0916(6), Wis. Stats. By November 15, the DNR is required to issue a report on all lands purchased during the preceding biennium in whole or in part with funds from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program for which public access for any nature-based outdoor activity (NBOA) has been prohibited. Section 23.0916(1)(b), Wis. Stats., defines nature-based outdoor activities as "... hunting, fishing, trapping, hiking, cross-country skiing, and any other nature-based activity designated by rule by the department ..." No additional NBOA were added by rule (ch. NR 52). This report must also include reasons for the prohibition.

The DNR is required to submit this report to the Joint Committee on Finance, the Senate Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, and the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources.

During the past biennium, the Department and its conservation partners have acquired a total of 76,645 acres for public recreation and habitat preservation through the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program. During this same timeframe, 1,115 acres acquired (1.45% of total) have prohibitions of one or more NBOA. Where prohibitions have occurred, public safety is the predominant reason. The Appendix at the back of this report provides additional detail for each project with an NBOA prohibition. Further details about any project may be requested from the Department.

## FINDINGS

Tables A and B on the following pages summarize land purchases using Stewardship funds where one or more NBOA was prohibited during the period July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2011.

Section 23.0916(6), Wis. Stats., allows the Natural Resources Board to approve an NBOA prohibition only for the following reasons (alpha codes appear in Tables A and B):

- A. To protect public safety
- B. To protect unique animal or plant communities
- C. To accommodate usership patterns

In addition, an NBOA may be prohibited without approval of the Natural Resources Board if all conditions of s. NR 52.05(1)(a)(5), Wis. Adm. Code, are met. Those conditions are:

- Parcel is five acres or less in size
- Parcel is located within boundary of a city or village
- Reason for NBOA prohibition is to protect public safety
- Parcel is not adjacent to a public waterway
- Parcel is not adjacent to another parcel where an NBOA prohibition already exists

This option appears as "D" in the "Reason" column in Tables A and B. Chapter NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code, became effective on August 1, 2010, and describes the process by which the Natural Resources Board may approve the use of Stewardship funds when one or more NBOAs are prohibited.

Lastly, Wisconsin Statutes identify other times when an NBOA prohibition is allowed without approval of the Natural Resources Board including: properties acquired by NCOs or governments other than the municipality who passed the public safety ordinance; state trails, and wildlife refuges. This option appears as Option "E" in the "Reason" column in Tables A and B.

[Note: The 2011-2013 Biennial Budget amended the Stewardship statutes by removing "usership patterns" as a reason for an NBOA prohibition, effective July 1, 2011.]

## Details by Project: Stewardship Projects with NBOA Prohibitions (listed in alphabetical order, by county)

### I. DEPARTMENT LANDS WITH PROHIBITIONS

#### **Portage County – Statewide Wildlife Habitat**

The Department acquired this property then closed it to all public uses -- including hunting, fishing, trapping, hiking, and cross-country skiing -- to prevent the spread of chronic wasting disease (CWD) from the property and to allow for CWD research. Originally known as the Hall Farm, this deer farm was discovered in 2006 to have the highest prevalence of deer testing positive for CWD of any deer farm in North America. All the deer in the operation were destroyed and the operation was required to stand vacant with fences maintained until May 24, 2011, per U.S. Department of Agriculture requirements. However, after May 24, 2011, requirements to maintain the fences to exclude wild deer would have expired if the DNR had not acquired the property.

### II. NON-DEPARTMENT LANDS WITH PROHIBITIONS (Grants)

#### **Brown County - City of Green Bay**

##### **Baird Creek Greenway**

The City of Green Bay was awarded Stewardship funds from the Urban Rivers subprogram to acquire 5.78 acres in the Baird Creek Greenway. Hunting is prohibited by local ordinance. This prohibitions was allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Brown County - Village of Suamico**

##### **Shoreland**

The Village of Suamico was awarded Stewardship funds from the Urban Green Space subprogram to acquire two parcels totaling 0.25 acres along Sunset Beach Lane, providing public access to the bay of Green Bay. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Chippewa County - City of Chippewa Falls**

##### **Casper Park parcel**

The City of Chippewa Falls was awarded Stewardship funds from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire approximately 2.0 acres for passive public outdoor recreation purposes at Casper Park. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed because this project met the requirements of s. NR 52.05(1)(a)(5), Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Columbia County - Natural Heritage Land Trust**

##### **Kimball- Kingsley Bend Mound Group**

The Natural Heritage Land Trust partnered with the Ho-Chunk Nation to acquire 2.75 acres in the Town of Newport, Columbia County, with a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram. This acquisition will protect a tribal cultural site at the Kingsley Bend Mound Group. The property is a former wayside which has been restored to an oak savanna ecosystem. The property was transferred to the Ho-Chunk Nation. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Dane County - City of Madison**

#### **Cherokee Park -- Filut parcel**

The City of Madison was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Rivers subprogram to acquire a 1-acre in-holding in Cherokee Park (Filut parcel). The acquisition will improve recreational access, provide land for a link in the city/regional bike trail, and eliminate an incompatible use within the park boundary. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Starkweather Creek – Blettner parcel**

The City of Madison was awarded Stewardship funds from the Urban Rivers subprogram to acquire 3.15 acres to add to Starkweather Creek Park. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Dane County - Natural Heritage Land Trust (NHLT)**

#### **Cherokee Marsh, Fifth Addition, Phase 2**

The Natural Heritage Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Areas subprogram to acquire 23 acres to Cherokee Marsh Conservation Park in the City of Madison. NHLT transferred the property to the City of Madison at closing. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Dane County - Village of Deforest**

#### **Yahara River -- Conservancy Place parcel**

The Village of DeForest was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 142 acres along the Yahara River Corridor within the Yahara River Conservancy. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Door County - Door County**

#### **Cana Island Park parcel**

Door County was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 1.32 acres adjacent to the causeway to the Cana Island Lighthouse Park. The acquisition expands the park, providing much needed off-street parking for visitors. Hunting and trapping are prohibited on this parcel per local ordinance. These prohibitions were approved by the Natural Resources Board at their meeting on March 23, 2011.

### **Door County - Door County Land Trust, Inc.**

#### **Bayshore Blufflands – DiMaso parcel**

Door County Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 2.7 acres (DiMaso parcel) for conservancy purposes in the Bayshore Blufflands State Natural Area. Trapping is prohibited due to unique plant and animal community protection and due to local ordinance. This prohibition was allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Bayshore Blufflands – Dyer parcel**

Door County Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 4.56 acres (Dyer property) for conservancy purposes in Bayshore Blufflands State Natural Area. Hunting and trapping are prohibited due to unique plant and animal community protection and due to local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Bayshore Blufflands - Lautenbach parcel**

Door County Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 2 acres (Lautenbach property) for conservancy purposes within the Bayshore Blufflands State Natural Area. Trapping is prohibited due to unique plant and animal community protection and due to local ordinance. This prohibition was allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Keller parcel**

Door County Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 1.38 acres (Keller tract) for conservancy purposes. DCLT also used \$10,000 in Federal Coastal Wetland Grant funds and \$130,000 of Natural Resource Damage Assessment money as match fund in this project. Hunting and trapping are prohibited due to unique plant and animal community protection and due to local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Sturgeon Bay Ship Canal parcel**

Door County Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 332 acres from Sturgeon Bay Utilities located in the Cave Point to Clay Banks State Natural Area. DCLT also used \$800,000 in Federal Coastal Wetlands funds for this project. DCLT is not prohibiting any NBOA on this property. However, hunting and trapping are prohibited by a local ordinance.

### **Door County - The Nature Conservancy**

#### **Pluff Parcel**

The Nature Conservancy (TNC) was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 27.7 acres (Pluff parcel) for conservancy purposes. TNC also used \$70,000 in Federal Coastal Wetlands grant funds for this project. Trapping is prohibited due to unique plant and animal communities and due to usership patterns. This prohibition was allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Door County - Village of Sister Bay**

#### **Four Seasons parcel**

The Village of Sister Bay was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Green Space subprogram to acquire 1.31 acres for the expansion of the Sister Bay Waterfront Park. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Waterfront Park Johnson parcel**

The Village of Sister Bay was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Green Space subprogram to acquire 0.96 acres along the shore of Lake Michigan in downtown Sister Bay. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. The Natural Resource Board approved these prohibitions at their meeting on March 23, 2011.

### **Green Lake County - City of Green Lake**

#### **Canal Street Boat Launch Land parcel**

The City of Green Lake was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Green Space and Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprograms to acquire 30,195 sq. ft. adjacent to the existing public boat launch. The land will be added to the public launch site and improved to provide more parking and additional park land for outdoor recreation. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions are allowed because this project met the requirements of s. NR 52.05(1)(a)(5), Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Jefferson County - Jefferson County**

#### **Dorothy Carnes Co. Park/Rose Lake State Natural Area -Kemmeter**

Jefferson County was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Green Space subprogram to acquire 120 acres to expand Dorothy Carnes County Park and Rose Lake State Natural Area. This parcel is the first acquisition in the Glacial Heritage Area. The parcel will be restored to 50-acre recreation area, bike trail head, and 70 acres of oak savanna and prairie habitat. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. The Natural Resource Board approved these prohibitions at their meeting on January 26, 2011.

### **La Crosse County - Mississippi Valley Conservancy**

#### **Onalaska Bluffs - Elmwood parcel with Kings Point match**

Mississippi Valley Conservancy (MVC) was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Areas subprogram to acquire 30.78 acres in the City of Onalaska. The property will be managed to maximize the wildlife habitat. MVC will transfer the property to the City of Onalaska. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. The Natural Resources Board approved these prohibitions at their meeting on December 8, 2010.

As match to this acquisition, MVC donated to the Stewardship program the 1065-acre King's Point property in Vernon County. MVC will manage this property to protect its Natural Area values and to maximize the wildlife habitat. King's Point will be open to the public for hunting, fishing, trapping, hiking, and cross country skiing. This 320-acre match property will be dedicated as a State Natural Area.

### **Milwaukee County - The Conservation Fund**

#### **Olsen (Dumke) parcel**

The Conservation Fund was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Area subprogram to acquire 33 acres in the City of Franklin for wildlife habitat preservation and flood control. Ownership of the property will be transferred to the DNR to be included in the Big Muskego Lake Wildlife Area. The Conservation Fund is not prohibiting any NBOA on this property. However, hunting and trapping are prohibited by a local ordinance.

### **Milwaukee County - River Revitalization Foundation**

#### **Chowanec parcel**

The River Revitalization Foundation was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Rivers and Urban Green Space subprograms to acquire 1.5 acres in the City of Milwaukee along the Milwaukee River for preservation, restoration, and outdoor recreation. The River Revitalization Foundation is not prohibiting any NBOA on this property. However, hunting and trapping are prohibited by a local ordinance.

### **Outagamie County - Friends of the Fox**

#### **Kaukauna/Lock #5 parcel**

The Friends of the Fox were awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Rivers subprogram to acquire two parcels totaling 0.84 acres, in the City of Kaukauna. These parcels will be used for passive nature based outdoor recreation. Once acquired, Friends of the Fox will transfer these two parcels to the Fox River Navigation System Authority for long-term ownership, operation, and maintenance. Hunting is prohibited on the property by local ordinance. The Natural Resources Board approved this prohibition at their meeting on February 23, 2011.

### **Ozaukee County - Ozaukee Washington Land Trust**

#### **Hammes-MacLaurin parcel**

The Ozaukee Washington Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Streambank Protection subprogram to acquire 6.6 acres along the Milwaukee River, Town of Fredonia, Ozaukee County. A total of 5.16 acres along a tributary stream to the Milwaukee River, Town of Fredonia, were donated to the Stewardship Program as match to the subject property. Ozaukee Washington Land Trust is not

prohibiting any NBOA on this property. However, hunting and trapping are prohibited by a local ordinance.

#### **Ozaukee County - Riveredge Nature Center, Inc.**

##### **Wallner parcel**

Riveredge Nature Center was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Streambank Protection subprogram to acquire 14 acres in the Town of Saukville for protection of Milwaukee River water quality, outdoor recreation opportunities, and environmental education. The 14 acres became a part of the larger wildlife refuge identified in s. NR 15(13), Wis. Admin. Code. Per s. 23.0916(4), Wis. Stats., this property is not subject to review under ch. NR 52, Wis. Admin. Code, because it is a designated wildlife refuge. Additionally, the prohibition on hunting is supported under the "usership pattern" exception due to high-volume environmental education programming that occurs at the refuge.

#### **Polk County - Village of Osceola**

##### **Ladd Memorial Park Acquisition and Development 2009-10**

The Village of Osceola was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 0.68 acres for the development of Ladd Memorial Park. The project will involve property acquisition and park development. The park development will consist of a trail system, with benches, information kiosk, and overlook of the St Croix River. Hunting is prohibited by local ordinance. This prohibition was allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **Sauk County - Village of Plain**

##### **Honey Creek Park**

The Village of Plain was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 5.67 acres on the north side of the Village for public park and green space. The park will have access to a tributary to Honey Creek. Hunting and trapping are prohibited on the property by local ordinance. The Natural Resources Board approved these prohibitions at their meeting on April 27, 2011.

#### **Shawano County – County of Shawano**

##### **Lake Park Property parcel**

Shawano County was awarded a Stewardship grant under the Urban Green Space subprogram to acquire a 0.35 acre addition to the Shawano County Lake Park. The subject property is located on the shores of Shawano Lake, along the western park boundary. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **St. Croix County - Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center**

##### **Carpenter Nature Center - in holding**

Carpenter Nature Center (CNC) was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Area subprogram to acquire a 7.5 acre in-holding farm located within their current property boundary. The CNC will restore 7.5 acres to natural prairie habitat. Another 2.5 acres of the farm will serve as an environmental center but is not covered by the Stewardship grant. Hunting and trapping are prohibited on this property due to usership patterns. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

#### **St. Croix County - Village of Woodville**

##### **Steven Memorial Park parcel**

The Village of Woodville was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 0.4 acres for the expansion of Steven Memorial Park. Hunting and trapping are prohibited on this property by local ordinance. These prohibitions are allowed because this project met the requirements of s. NR 52.05(1)(a)(5), Wis. Adm. Code

### **Vilas County - The Nature Conservancy**

#### **Border Lakes State Natural Area, Shibilski/Bayba**

The Nature Conservancy was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Natural Areas subprogram to acquire 62 acres to expand the Catherine Wolter Wilderness Area within Border Lakes State Natural Area, Vilas County, for conservancy purposes. Trapping is prohibited due to unique plant and animal community protection and due to usership patterns. This prohibitions is allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Walworth County - City of Whitewater**

#### **Clay Street Nature Park Expansion**

The City of Whitewater was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 0.79 acres (Schilt parcel) to expand the existing Clay Street Nature Park. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Washington County - Cedar Lakes Conservation Foundation**

#### **Lidington parcel**

The Cedar Lakes Conservation Foundation was awarded a Stewardship grant from the State Trails subprogram to acquire 27.9 acres in the Town of Polk, Washington County, to extend the Ice Age National Scenic Trail. Hunting and trapping are prohibited on this property by local ordinance. By statute, NBOA prohibitions are allowed on state trails.

### **Washington County - Ozaukee Washington Land Trust**

#### **Kratsch parcel**

The Ozaukee Washington Land Trust was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Areas subprogram to acquire 72.5 acres along the Milwaukee River in the Town of Trenton, Washington County. Ozaukee Washington Land Trust is not prohibiting any NBOA on this property. However, hunting and trapping are prohibited by a local ordinance.

### **Waukesha County - City of Brookfield**

#### **Hawks Pointe parcel (Endicott Park Exp.)**

The City of Brookfield was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks subprogram to acquire 11.46 acres for nature-based recreation and to expand Endicott Park. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. The Natural Resources Board approved these prohibitions at their meeting on April 27, 2011.

### **Waukesha County - The Conservation Fund**

#### **Vollmer parcel**

The Conservation Fund was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Areas subprogram to acquire 24 acres in the City of Brookfield, Waukesha County, for wildlife habitat preservation and flood control. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

### **Waukesha County - Waukesha County Dept of Parks & Land Use**

#### **Monches Park Expansion**

Waukesha County was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Rivers subprogram to acquire 3.8 acre to expand the existing Monches County Park. Monches Park is located on the Oconomowoc River, Town of Merton. Hunting and trapping are prohibited by local ordinance. These prohibitions were allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

**Waukesha County - Waukesha County Land Conservancy**

**Isaak Walton parcel**

The Waukesha County Land Conservancy was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Habitat Areas subprogram to acquire 40 acres in the Town of Ottawa, Waukesha County, to expand the Ottawa Wildlife refuge. Trapping is prohibited due to usership patterns. This prohibitions was allowed under the *Interim Protocol*, prior to the effective date of ch. NR 52, Wis. Adm. Code.

**Winnebago County - Town of Neenah**

**Herziger Conservancy parcel**

The Town of Neenah was awarded a Stewardship grant from the Urban Rivers subprogram to acquire 10.88 acres for Herziger Conservancy Park. Hunting is prohibited by local ordinance. The Natural Resources Board approved this prohibition at their meeting on March 23, 2011.
