

**Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia virus (VHSV)  
Susceptible Species in Wisconsin**

The following fish species are:

A. Listed by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) as susceptible to VHS, and, or B. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), Veterinary Services (VS), has credible information about diagnostic and/or clinical evidence that these species are susceptible to VHS.

For regulatory purposes, VHSV and VHS, the disease caused by the virus, are considered synonymous.
