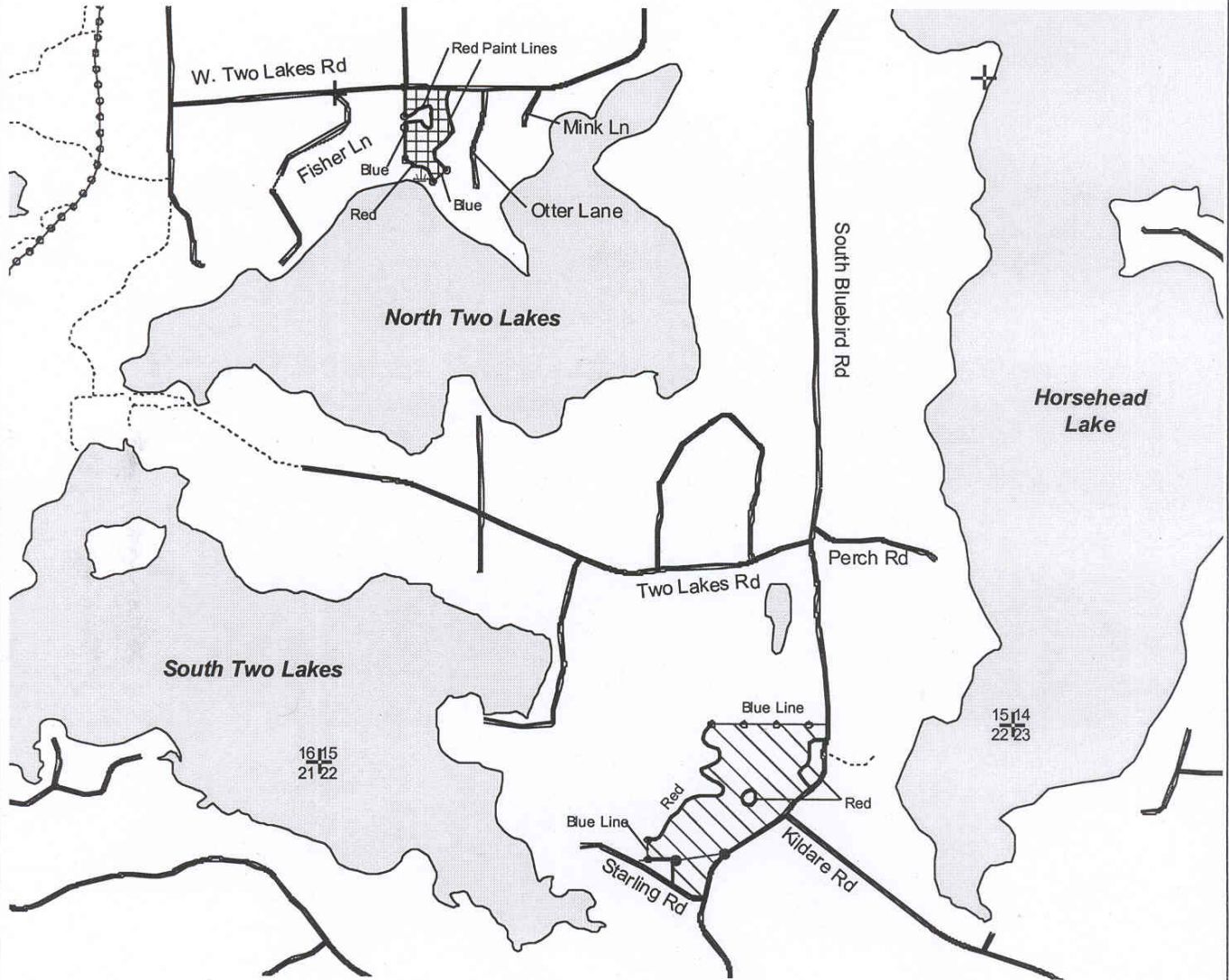

Special Conditions:

1. Treat slash within 50 feet of the Town Road. (16)
2. Leave all the standing dead trees that are not a safety hazard. (35)
3. There is a logging road (accessible off of Otter Lane) that may be used to access the harvest area, or access may be gained directly off of West Two Lakes Road. The driveway on the far south end of the property should not be used without permission being granted by the sale administrator. (18)
4. An on-site meeting with DNR forester is required prior to the sale. (35)
