Grant or Loan Program	Who Awards	Application Deadline
BEBR Grants (Blight Elimination and Brownfield Redevelopment) – for local governments ¹ & private parties for brownfield cleanup and redevelopment. Can include acquisition costs & building renovation.	WI Dept. of Commerce	No deadline, continuous applications
Ready for Reuse Grants & Loans – for local governments, grants & 0% loans for up to 23 years for cleanup of petroleum & hazardous substances. Some federal requirements apply.	WI Dept. of Natural Resources	No deadline, continuous applications
TEA Grants (Transportation Economic Assistance) – for public or private entities with road, rail, harbor & airport projects that promote development and attract and retain businesses.	WI Dept. of Transportation	No deadline, continuous applications
Brownfield Assessment Grants – for local governments to inventory & assess brownfield areas for contamination from petroleum & hazardous substances. No cost share.	Environmental Protection Agency	October 16 2009
Brownfield Cleanup Grants – for local governments to clean up specific brownfield properties with contamination from petroleum & hazardous substances.	Environmental Protection Agency	October 16 2009
Brownfield Revolving Loan Fund Grants – for local governments to establish a loan & sub-grant program for cleanup of petroleum & hazardous substances.	Environmental Protection Agency	October 16 2009
Coastal Management Grants – for all counties adjacent to Lakes Superior and Michigan, may be used for planning, acquisition, restoration, non-point control, public access & education.	WI Dept. of Administration	November 2, 2009
Site Assessment Grants (SAG) – for local governments to use for environmental assessments, site investigations, demolition, and removal of abandoned containers and underground tanks.	WI Dept. of Natural Resources	November 9 2009
Stewardship Grants – for local governments & non-profit groups, can be applied at brownfield sites for development of parks, urban river projects and urban green space projects.	WI Dept. of Natural Resources	May 1, 2010

¹ In many cases “local governments” includes tribes as well as redevelopment, community development & housing authorities.
