COMPLIANCE AUDIT PROGRAM – If you want to do a voluntary self-audit to confirm that your business or facility is in compliance with all Department of Natural Resources environmental regulations before you apply for Green Tier, you can do so and be shielded from civil enforcement for up to one year. The program assures you will not be subject to large forfeitures for voluntarily reporting violations discovered during a compliance audit that meet program eligibility requirements. LEVELS OF PARTICIPATION

TIER 1 AND TIER 2: Green Tier has two tiers, or participation levels. Tier 1 is designed to encourage innovation, collaboration and new environmental goal setting. Tier 2 involves more rigorous participation requirements, places greater emphasis on superior environmental performance, and uses contracts as a means of giving customized regulatory flexibility proportional to environmental performance.

CHARTERS: A charter is a contract entered into by the DNR and an association committed to helping its members participate in Green Tier. An association may consist of private entities, public entities, or a combination. Charters help business sectors or regions establish and meet environmental objectives.
