

Public Notice on an Application for Participation in Tier I of Green Tier

Pursuant to Section 299.83, Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) hereby gives notice that DNR has received an application for participation in Tier I of Green Tier from The Boldt Company, 2525 N Roemer Rd, Appleton, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, 54912. Founded in 1889 as Oscar J. Boldt Construction, it now offers general contracting as well as facility planning and management assistance, project development, and consultation services. The Boldt Company encourages environmental responsibility in their construction projects, employing LEED accredited professionals to design new projects and promoting recycling at building sites. At their home office, the Green Team monitors environmental practices, and a recent audit by Focus on Energy has led to many energy efficiency improvements. As a Green Tier participant, The Boldt Company will develop an Environmental Management System as well as make considerable improvements to its corporate office in order to qualify for LEED for Existing Buildings certification.

Opportunity for public to comment or request a public meeting

DNR will accept written comments from the public regarding the application through August 11, 2008. Comments may be submitted to Tom Eggert (see above).

Also within the 30-day comment period, individuals may request a public informational meeting concerning this application by submitting a written request to the DNR contact. If DNR determines there is significant interest in this application, DNR will hold a public informational meeting.

How DNR will make final decisions

DNR will determine whether the applicant has satisfied all of the eligibility requirements in sec. 299.83(3), Wis. Stats. If all eligibility requirements are met, DNR will approve this application unless doing so is not in the best interest of the Green Tier program. A decision by DNR to approve or deny an application for Tier I of Green Tier is not subject to review under state laws governing contested case hearings.
