

## WISCONSIN WATER &amp; WASTEWATER FUNDING SOURCES &amp; ASSISTANCE

<b>Organization</b>	<b>DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES (DNR)</b>
<b>Program Title</b>	Well Compensation Program (Grant Award)
<b>Eligible Applicants</b>	Owner of a <b>chemical or bacteria</b> contaminated private water supply that exceeds the standard health advisory level and you have received a Health Advisory letter or have had qualifying water tests done by a certified lab and that well serves a residence or is used for watering livestock. <i>(See exceptions on web site identified below.)</i>  Annual family income may not be more than \$65,000 for the previous year. Further, if family income is between \$45,000 and \$65,000, the award will be reduced by \$.30 for each dollar of income exceeding \$45,000.
<b>Grant Award, Loan or Other Type of Program</b>	Grant Award with addition hardship award possible for low income owner.
<b>Eligible Project Type</b>	Replace well, treatment device or connection to municipal water.
<b>Funding Available Per Year Per Program</b>	\$294,000 is available for spending per fiscal year.
<b>Maximum Grant Award/Loan</b>	Grant award provides 75% of total eligible cost, up to a maximum grant award amount of \$9,000 for one private residence contaminated well with possible addition hardship award for low income owner. If you receive funding from any other private sources to cover some or all of the costs of your replacement water supply, your grant award will be reduced if the sum of the Well Compensation Grant and the other grant exceeds 100% of the eligible costs.
<b>Application Cycle</b>	Continuous: Application claims <u>must be submitted</u> to the DNR Region Water Supply Specialist after contamination eligibility has been identified by the DNR Region Water Supply Specialist. The grant award is for one year from the date of the grant award issued by the DNR Grant Manager.
<b>Estimated Time to Prepare An Application</b>	The application is a combination of required information from the Claimant, DNR Region Water Supply Specialist, and the Well Driller. It is difficult to estimate preparation time due to the complexity involved.

<b>Additional Comments</b>	The Department of Natural Resources is required by the Internal Revenue Service to send a 1099G for tax filing purposes as a result of payment for a "Well Compensation Grant Award Program Claim." It is the department's understanding that "awards to individuals" is considered "other income."  Only one additional claim may be submitted within ten years after an award is made if the replaced private well fails.  <b>The costs for any work done before the claim is filed and approved by the DNR are not eligible for reimbursement.</b>  Reference: <b>Wisc.
