The following chart gives an idea of items that, based on current interpretation of state statutes and administrative rules, are and are not eligible for reimbursement by the **Forest Fire Protection (FFP)** Grant Program administered by the Department of Natural Resources. <p>Off-road Vehicles (limited to individual fire departments only) used primarily for forest fire suppression; such items include:</p> <p>ATV, RTV, UTV used primarily for wildland fire suppression Standard all-wheel drive trucks, ½ to 5-ton capacity equipped to fight forest fires Tenders (tankers) with tanks that hold 1,000 gallons or less if equipped with mounted pumps and go off-road Initial changes or repairs to a recently acquired vehicle to prepare it for forest fire fighting immediately after acquisition, such as: Paint Identification letters and numbers Truck Brush Guards Truck Bumpers Truck Compartments</p>	<p>Off-road Vehicles</p> <p>Light bars if installed on initial-attack brush trucks Rehab Trailer Standard trucks that do not have all-wheel drive (not off-road) Tenders (tankers) with tanks that hold more than 1,000 gallons Tenders (tankers) not equipped to go off-road Trailers to haul ATV, RTV, or UTV Tires, vehicle maintenance, and repair for existing trucks</p>
