Notice: Per s. NR45.09(9), Wis. Adm. Code, **the hunter must carry this permit at all times while deer hunting in Blue Mound State Park.**

For All Parks Within CWD Zones

To be eligible to hunt deer in any state park located within the CWD Management Zone (CWD-MZ), a hunter must first obtain the appropriate State Park Hunting Permit issued at either the park to be hunted or at DNR Service Centers within the CWD Zones.

1 Buck plus Unlimited Earn-a-Buck Seasons

1 Buck plus Unlimited Earn-a-Buck (EAB) regulations are in effect for Blue Mound State Park during the following season dates:

Archery:	Oct 17, 2011 – Dec. 7, 2011 Dec. 12, 2011 – Jan. 8, 2012
Gun:	Nov. 19, 2011 – Nov. 27, 2011
Muzzleloader:	Nov. 28, 2011 – Dec. 7, 2011

Unlimited Antlerless Only Hunts

Unlimited antlerless only hunts are in effect for the dates listed below. Deer may be harvested using a firearm or a bow. No antlered deer may be taken during the antlerless only hunts. During these seasons you will receive an EAB sticker for every antlerless deer harvested.

Gun/Archery:	Oct. 13, 2011 – Oct. 16, 2011 (hunting hours end at 12 noon each day) Dec. 8, 2011 – Dec. 11, 2011

Tagging Instructions (see pages 9-17 in the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations* pamphlet for complete tagging instructions)

Hunters may use any of the tags listed below to tag a buck or an antlerless deer in the CWD-MZ. Earn-a-Buck requirement does not apply to a person's **ONE** Archery Buck Deer Carcass Tag or to a person's **ONE** Gun Buck Deer Carcass Tag. Earn-a-Buck rules do apply to all other bucks harvested in the CWD-MZ.

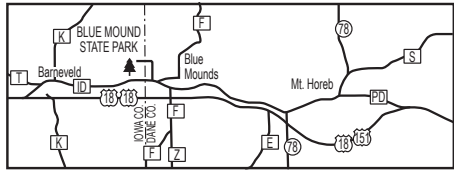
REMEMBER, non-hunting park visitors are also enjoying the park during the deer hunting season. Make sure you know where closed areas, campgrounds, buildings and trails are located to minimize user conflicts.

Hiking and snowshoeing are prohibited on designated cross-country ski trails when the trails are snow covered.

BLUE MOUND STATE PARK 2011 DEER SEASON REGULATIONS

(See the 2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations for additional regulations)

1. Gun deer hunting in the park will be allowed October 13-16, 2011 (hunting hours close at 12 noon each day), November 19–27, 2011, and December 8-11, 2011. Archery hunting will be allowed in the park October 13-16, 2011 (hunting hours close at 12 noon each day), Oct. 17, 2011 – January 8, 2012. Muzzleloader hunting will be allowed November 28-December 7, 2011.
Note: archers are required to wear blaze orange during the firearm seasons.
2. All legal firearms for deer hunting in CWD zones as well as bow and arrow will be legal for use in Blue Mound State Park this deer season. This includes shotguns, muzzleloaders, handguns, and rifles. Please see the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations* pamphlet for further information on legal weapons. All firearms must be unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case and bows must be unstrung or enclosed within a carrying case when in or on a motor vehicle or within a closed area of the park.
3. Daily hunting hours in the park are listed in the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations* pamphlets, except during the October 13-16 hunt when hunting hours end at **12 NOON** each day. Daily hunting hours for the rest of the hunts are the hours listed in the regulations pamphlet.
4. A hunter with this State Park Hunting Permit, the appropriate deer hunting license and tags valid in the CWD Zones (Please see the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations* pamphlet for the complete list of valid permits for CWD Zones) may hunt in the park during the seasons listed in #1 above.
5. Some areas of the park are posted as closed areas (see map on reverse side). A wounded deer moving into the closed area may not be pursued by the hunter. Park rangers must be informed by the hunter of the location of any wounded animal within the closed area. Park rangers will evaluate the situation and may authorize the hunter to recover the deer.
6. All parking and traffic regulations apply during the seasons. Vehicles shall be operated only on established roads and parking permitted only in established parking lots and shoulders of established roads.
7. **It is illegal to hunt within 50 feet of the roadway's center or discharge a firearm or shoot an arrow from a bow from or across a park road. It is illegal to shoot within 100 yards of a building devoted to human occupancy.**
8. Park admission stickers are required on all vehicles that enter the park (\$7/day or \$25/annual for vehicles with Wisconsin license plates; \$10/day or \$35/annual for vehicles without Wisconsin license plates). Hunters are encouraged to purchase a vehicle admission sticker prior to the season to avoid delays in entering the park and arriving at hunting areas.
9. Hunters may enter the park no more than 1 hour before legal shooting hours.
10. **Caution! Other recreationists will be using state parks during the deer hunting seasons and may not be wearing blaze orange. Please be sure of your target and know what is beyond.**
11. **Blue Mound State Park is in the Monitoring Area which requires all adult deer to be sampled. Please visit <http://dnr.wi.gov/org/land/wildlife/hunt/> for sampling locations.**

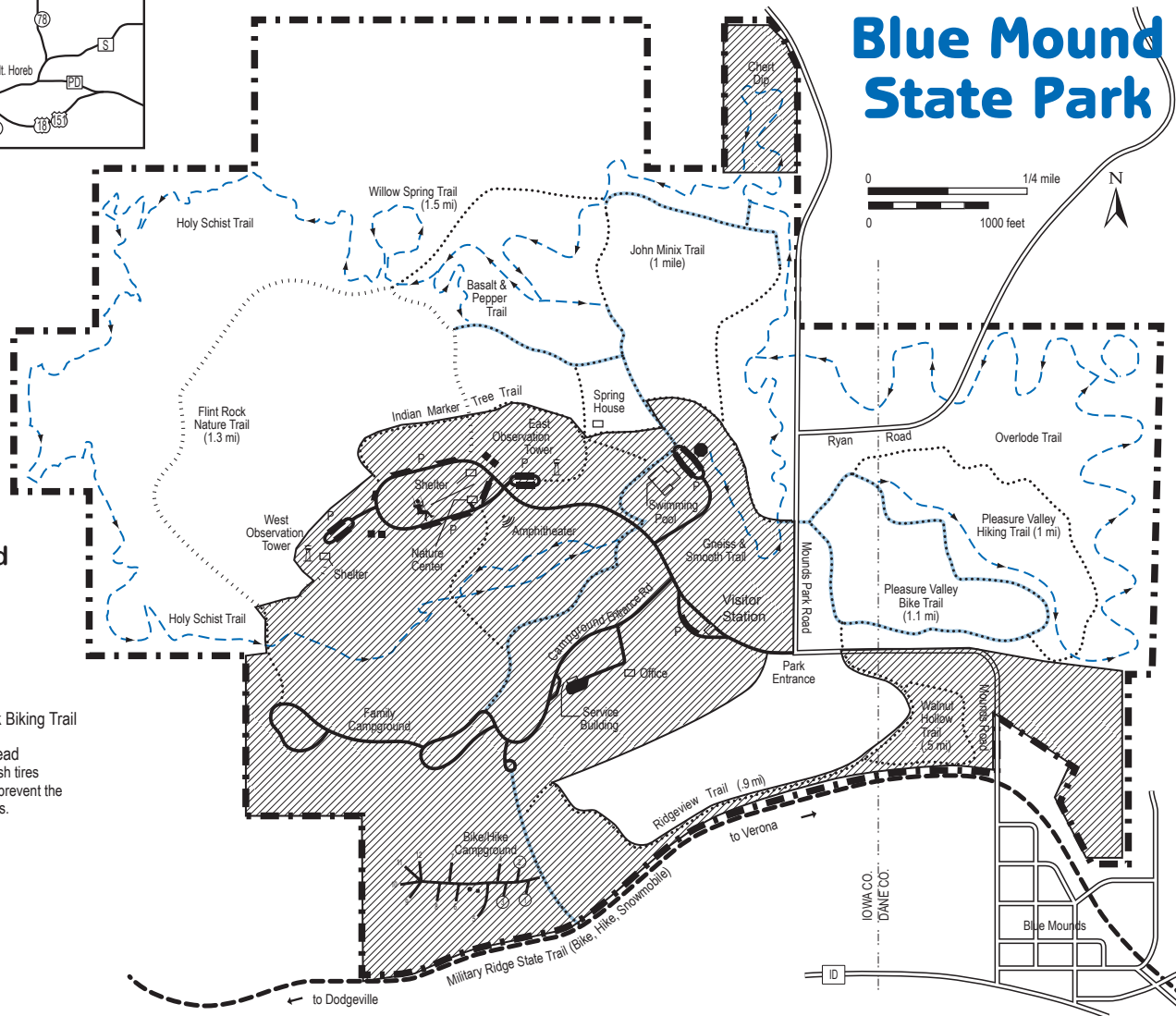


Blue Mound State Park
