

# Kohler-Andrae State Park 2011 Deer Season

## Special Regulations – DMU 77E

Only holders of a 2011 Park Access Permit for deer hunting in Kohler-Andrae State Park (Deer Management unit 77E) may deer hunt in the park. A maximum of 40 (forty) Kohler-Andrae Park Access Permits for deer hunting will be available in 2011. Park Access Permits are issued on a first come, first served basis and can be obtained from any license vendor or via the DNR license sales website at [dnr.wi.gov](http://dnr.wi.gov). Access Permits go on sale starting at noon, Saturday, August 20, 2011. On all vehicles that enter the park, Park admission stickers are required (\$7 per day or \$25 annually for residents; \$10 per day or \$35 annually for non-residents). Hunters are encouraged to purchase stickers before opening morning to avoid delays at the office. Stickers may be purchased at the park office or at the self-sticker sales booth located adjacent to the park office. Eligible hunters will not be required to check in at the park office before hunting.

### Season Dates

- Kohler-Andrae State Park will be open to gun deer hunting (muzzleloaders only) November 19 – December 7, 2011. Kohler-Andrae State Park will not be open to deer hunting during any other gun hunting seasons.
- Archery deer hunting will be open in the park from November 19 – January 8, 2011. Archers must meet blaze orange requirements from November 19 – December 7, 2011 when muzzleloader hunting is also open in the park.

### Weapon Restrictions

- **Only Muzzleloaders** may be used to hunt deer during the November 19 – December 7, 2011 season. Please see the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations* for muzzleloader restrictions. All firearms must be unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case when in or on a motor vehicle or within a closed area of the park.

Note: Muzzleloaders are considered unloaded if the cap is removed from a cap lock muzzleloader, or the flash pan is cleaned on a flint-lock muzzleloader; the ball and powder may remain in the barrel, except that the powder and projectile must be removed from the barrel of an electronic ignition muzzleloader.

### Tagging Options

- **Herd Control regulations apply in Kohler-Andrae State Park for the 2011 park deer hunting season** (see the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations* booklet for tagging requirements).
- Muzzleloader hunters that receive a 2011 Park Access Permit for unit 77E may use their Gun Buck Deer Carcass Tag to tag a buck during the 19-day muzzleloader season listed above.
- Archery hunters that possess a valid archery license and a Park Access Permit for unit 77E may harvest a buck with their unfilled Archery Buck Deer Carcass Tag and one antlerless deer with their Archery Antlerless Deer Carcass Tag.
- In addition, muzzleloader and archery hunters may tag additional antlerless deer per Antlerless Deer Carcass Tag valid in Herd Control or Earn-a-Buck Units. One tag comes free with each gun or archery deer hunting license.
- Additional Antlerless Herd Control Carcass Tags valid in “Herd Control & EAB” units are \$2 each (for residents and non-residents) and may be purchased online or at any DNR

license sales location.

### Hunting Hours

- Hunting hours are found in the *2011 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations*. Hunters may enter the park up to one hour before the legal hunting hours begin for the day.

### Deer Registration

- Any deer harvested in Kohler-Andrae State Park must be registered at a registration station in the adjacent unit of kill. A list of registration stations is available on the DNR website ([dnr.wi.gov](http://dnr.wi.gov)) or at DNR Service Centers.
- When registering a deer harvested from Kohler-Andrae State Park, indicate “77E” as the DMU of Kill.

### Additional Park Regulations

- Some areas of the park will be posted as closed to hunting (see map on back). A wounded deer moving into the closed area may not be pursued by the hunter and deer may not be driven from a closed area. Park employees must be informed by the hunter of the locality of any wounded animal within the closed area. Park employees may assist the hunter in recovery of the deer.
- All parking and traffic regulations apply. Vehicles shall be operated only on established roads and parking is permitted only in established parking lots.
- Use of salt blocks and bait for deer is illegal.
- It is illegal to hunt within 50 feet of the roadway's center or discharge a firearm from or across a park road.
- Group Hunting is restricted to persons in possession of a 2011 Park Access Permit for unit 77E. Persons who have filled their carcass tags may continue to engage in group hunting, providing they have their unit 77E Park Access Permits and gun deer licenses in their possession.
- Portable tree stands and blinds may be used provided they are removed from the property each day at the close of hunting hours. No person may cause damage to trees by the placement or erection of portable tree stands or by any other manner while climbing or hunting from a tree.
- Any tree stand that is not occupied during legal hunting hours shall have the owner's customer ID number or name and address attached to the tree stand in a manner that is visible to a person on the ground.
- Ground blinds used on DNR lands must have a minimum of 144 square inches of highly visible blaze orange material that is visible 360 degrees around the blind, any time a gun deer season is in effect.
- All hunters should be aware of other recreational users within the park. **Not all people will be wearing blaze orange, so be sure of your target and beyond!**
