In Wisconsin late season archery has been difficult. Archery all along has been humbling enough. Just to place yourself 20 yards from a whitetail. Crossbows have the same characteristics as a compound. Except for the use of optics and the ability to be locked in the firing position. The problem in late season is less cover, and spookier deer. With the aid of optics and less movement, I know shot placement would improve. Ending in less wounded and more harvested deer.

There is truly enough deer for archery season, gun season, and muzzleloader season, and crossbow seasons.

Many WI archery hunters are suffering because they don't have the choice for the best tool to compliment their late season hunt.

Be it resolved, that the Conservation Congress understands that this is an opportunity for all hunters in WI to have a choice in an ethical way to harvest a whitetail deer. So in working with the proper departments, action can be taken to correct this non-existent season, by introducing rule change to allow late season whitetail hunting with crossbows. Some other states allow it now.
