FAQ and Definitions

What is a high capacity well? A high capacity well is any well on a high capacity property. A high capacity property is one property that has or will have one or more wells with a combined approved pumping capacity of 70 gallons per minute (gpm) or more. The capacity for each well is determined by the rated maximum capacity of the pump installed in the well, or the rate that the well flows at if it is a flowing well. The total capacity of all wells on the property is used to determine whether or not the wells are high capacity wells. Thus, in some cases residential wells are high capacity wells, even if every well on the property has a capacity of less than 70 gpm.

"Public water system" means a system for the provision to the public of piped water for human consumptions if such system has at least 15 service connections or regularly serves an average of at least 25 individuals daily at least 60 days per year. A public water system is either a community water system or a non-community water system. Such system includes: (a) Any collection, treatment, storage, and distribution facilities under control of the operator of such system and used primarily in connection with such system, and (b) Any collection or pretreatment storage facilities not under such control which are used primarily in connection with such system.
