	 on UTV safety and OHM safety. Finalizing the 2015 Annual ATV/UTV Safety Report. We ended 2015 with 20 fatalities, down from 27 in 2014 (record). Monitoring a serious ATV crash that happened in La Crosse Co. on 2/27/16 to see if turns into the 1st fatality of 2016. SB 381 related to small UTVs will be signed into law on 3/1. Summary of the law is attached to the minutes. 	
5. Committee Reports	 Joint meeting with Snowmobile Recreation Council Bryan talked about the bridge issues, turns out it's not an ATV issue, it's a Snowmobile issue because the USFS is building their bridges to accommodate the traffic. Snowmobilers realize it's their issue. Cost share will start at 50/50 and be adjusted for specific program priorities. 	
	 Advisor to Council – A proposed guidance was passed out and is posted with the minutes. The By-Laws clearly allow for consulting with experts when needed. When an advisor is needed for a particular situation the Council may call upon an individual or organization to provide one depending on the situation. The conflict of interest has been addressed by an attorney in the past and WCFA members have been member of the previous DNR appointed ORV Council. 	Motion by Ernest Pulvermacher to eliminate the position of WCFA advisor. Second by Jim Wisneski. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. The Council emphasizes that they are addressing a fundamental flaw in the concept of having an advisor position in this situation. This action does not relate to Mike Peterson, who occupied the position, as an individual.
	• Application Improvement Initiative Bryan, Jim, Ed were on the committee to develop recommendations to improve grant applications.	Motion and second to adopt this guidance as a supplement to the existing application and funding priority guidance.

Their recommendation is posted with the minutes. The intent is to assist applicants in submitting a well- developed submission on which the council can act, and to assist the council in ensuring that available funds are properly allocated to meet the needs of the program.	MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

In 2009 the STC studied the issue and in cooperation with the Governor's Office came up with a system where the Council reviews the applications and forwards them to the Governor's office with information. The Council may make	

	 recommendations, all applications will be forwarded to the Governor and the Governor makes the decision on who will be appointed. The Governor's Appointment Secretary has said they welcome this input from Governor's Councils. The appointment process is posted with the minutes. Clarifying Troute language. This issue was discussed again. Troutes are now a maintenance-only program. Troutes were officially created to save the ATV access to County Forest Roads that had been designated as trails in violation of the statute. The trail funding would have been cut off completely if troutes hadn't been created. The Council will be reviewing Troute applications at the Application Review meeting in June. 	
6. Council Member Matters 6. Citizen Participation	Ernie received a call regarding the plate and stickers. The caller was suggesting instead of having the license and 2 stickers. The department would go to 1 larger sticker for the license plate. He felt I was about the same as the 2 stickers or a hunter's back tag, so there wouldn't be any additional cost. <u>WATVA</u> – Getting ready for annual meeting which has been	
	scaled back due to loss of funding. Will be meeting with Rep. Czaja and a policy advisor to the Governor to discuss the grant. <u>PUBLIC</u> – None <u>Off-Highway Motorcycles</u> Bryan talked about the OHM bill that the Governor signed	

	into law on 2/29/2016. It's similar to the ATV program, has a separate funding source and Council. The funding may be used for ATV trails if OHMs are allowed. Priority is for single-track trail. The law will take effect this fall and there is much work to be done before then. Bryan recently became the head of the WI Off-Highway Motorcycle Assn.
