Signs to notify the public were displayed at Schmeeckle and their staff was also informed of the change of venue.

4. Chair Report		Rob deferred until the items were reached on the agenda.	
5. Department F	Reports	<ul> <li>Budget</li> <li>Trail Guidance - The DNR has created a team to create trail guidance for all types of recreation. The team will consist of DNR staff representing grants, parks, forestry, wetland and stormwater both central office and field. It's being sponsored by Deputy Division Administrators for the Business &amp; External Services Division and the Fish, Wildlife and Parks Division.</li> <li>Infrastructure Committee of the Snowmobile Recreation Council (SRC) meeting</li> <li>Nomination process – Cathy explained that due to increased workload and staff shortages that she would not be able to work on revising the Council nomination/appointment project that the Governor's Appointments Direction has already said is welcome.</li> <li>Bad River development grant - Ed gave an update on the Bad River Tribe development grant. He's had some difficulty making contact; he's planning a site visit before the August meeting.</li> </ul>	The current budget shows \$410,000 remaining from the '16-17 season. This surplus is due to storm damage being less than anticipated in some areas and that not all storm damage has been awarded. The counties have had a much more difficult time working with FEMA than in past years. The first trail guidance the team will focus on is ATV/UTV. Our partners including councils, statewide user groups, statewide associations, professional organizations, counties, etc. will be included in the process. The Infrastructure Committee of the SRC will write an issue brief on the Bridge Load issue and share that with the ORVC. A joint meeting will be arranged after the August funding meetings to address this and any other joint issues. Bryan Much is going to take the lead on getting that process updated and amended. Bad River development grant – if significant progress has not been made on Phase 1, the Council may want to consider releasing the funds set aside for Phase 2 until they are ready to proceed.

6. Dead Horse Trail meeting report	A meeting was held in April with DNR Grants Staff, DNR Water Reg Staff, ORVC Members Rob & Bryan, and USFS members.	The project salvages much of the work and money that has already gone into it. It was too late in their fiscal year to start the process but it will be on their project list for the next year, we were told.
	The original plan called for a trail to be built with boardwalks constructed to span the wetlands. The project was completed in segments without the boardwalks. Now the USFS doesn't want to construct boardwalks for several reasons. Various options were discussed.	We expect to have an update for the August funding meeting.
7. Regional Opportunities Analysis (ROA) update	Meetings continue, they are collecting user information from user groups and associations regionally for feedback regarding recreation properties statewide.	
	Results will be used to help create and update Master Plans on DNR owned/managed properties.	
8. ATV, UTV & Troute Application Review		Dave Traczyk moved to amend ATV35237 (scope and cost) to purchase an additional 80 acres at Dyracuse Intense Use Park. Second by Adam Harden. Motion Passed Unanimously.
		Bryan Much moved to amend ATV3524 (scope & cost) increasing the amount by \$19,752 to a total of \$69,894.71. Second by Adam Harden. Motion Passed Unanimously.
		Bryan Much moved to recommend funding storm damage in Oconto Co. for an amount up to \$27,500 with proper documentation. Second by Bobby Donahue. Motion Passed Unanimously.
		<b>NOTE</b> : The county will be required to document the damage, provide an estimate or documentation of repair work and explain why the work couldn't be performed using regular maintenance funds.

Trail/Grant Issues	<ul> <li>2017-18 projects were reviewed by the Council.</li> <li>Many projects required no additional data.</li> <li>Some projects had outstanding questions, those projects will be considered at the August meeting, provided those questions/requests are addressed.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The <u>funding spreadsheet</u> is posted with the minutes.</li> <li>If the Committee had unanswered questions, those questions are listed on the spreadsheet.</li> <li>Those questions need to be answered in order for the Full Council to make a decision on recommending funding for these projects.</li> </ul>
	RTP funding decisions will be made in July so will be known by the time of the August funding meeting.	There was an extended discussion regarding cost share splits between ORVC & SRC. In the end, no determination

10. Council members' matters	<ul> <li>was made but the council did indicate their intention to fund certain projects at other than 50% for several specific applications. Those are noted on the funding spreadsheet.</li> <li>Note: the following motions relate only to the cost share amount of funding. These motions will be considered for funding recommendations at the August meeting.</li> <li>Projects #13, 14, &amp; 15 Marathon County – Ernie Pulvermacher moved to consider a 75/25 split on projects #13, 14, &amp; 15 on the spreadsheet. All are Marathon County projects. Second by Bryan Much. 3 Ayes, 2 Nos, Motion Passed.</li> <li>Project #17 Washburn County – Ernie Pulvermacher moved to consider funding ½ of the 14,000 bridge load (dependent on RTP funding) not to exceed \$53,375. Motion Passed.</li> <li>Project #32 Vilas County – Bryan Much moved to consider funding 75% of project (less RTP if received) at the 14,000 bridge load cost. Second by Adam Harden. Motion Passed.</li> <li>Ernie echoed Bobby's thought s from earlier in the meeting regarding the fact that machines are getting larger and heavier and the Council needs to keep that in mind when making decisions.</li> <li>Bryan also listed the items the Council will need to focus on after the funding meeting:         <ul> <li>Bridge load funding levels</li> <li>Winder-only trail funding</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Offer information to grant applicants about the effect of including additional sources of funds as appropriate for projects instead of solely seeking ATV funds especially where other trail uses are involved.</li> </ul>
