Meeting called to order at 10:00 AM by RW.
	2. Acceptance of Minutes of Previous Meeting	Minutes of August 8,2023 & September 27, 2023	Motion by BN, seconded by JA to approve the minutes of August 8, 2023. No discussion. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by BN, seconded by JA to approve the minutes of September 27, 2023. Discussion regarding the transposed numbers on the City of Menasha award amount that will be corrected by BW. Motion carried unanimously.

	Recommendations for project funding	JA made a motion to approve a grant for: 1. Milwaukee County McKinley Marina Boat Ramp Improvements for 9.2% of total project costs, not to exceed \$137,292.00, BN seconded. Discussion included that this was all the funding they would receive for this project. Motion carried unanimously.

- a. Filling Commissioner Vacancy:
 The Lake Superior seat has bee
 - The Lake Superior seat has been vacant for some time. and due to the difficulty of finding an individual to represent this watershed, CH presented the idea of working with the Governor's Office to expand the existing boundary for this commission seat to include the counties of Burnett, Washburn, Sawyer, Price, Oneida, and Vilas. There is also the idea of changing the language of the seat requirements for this watershed relating to residency and applicable professional or personal experience related to Lake Superior. The commissioners discussed if this would be changed for all watershed areas represented on the commission, if the additional counties listed would be sufficient to fill the seat, how to define what personal/professional experience would be sufficient to qualify, and if the current commission is required to vote on the proposed changes. It was decided that expanding the county range would be the most logical first step toward the ultimate goal of filling this vacancy. CH and BW will work with the Governor's Office on the proposed watershed boundary expansion. Although the Commission is not required to vote on these changes, RW felt it would be a good idea to formally do so as a sign of support. JA made a motion to include the counties of Burnett, Washburn, Sawyer, Oneida and Vilas, with the option to include St. Croix and Polk if deemed necessary, to the Lake Superior Watershed Commission seat boundary. Further, the revised commission requirements language should include that the commissioner must own property within one of these counties but does not have to be a permanent resident of that county, but do need to be a resident of the state of Wisconsin. BN seconded motion. Motion carried unanimously.
- b. Small Cap Increase

BW the potential need to increase the total project costs cap on small projects that are not required to be presented to the commission. Costs for projects are increasing. The commission discussed increasing the cap for small projects. Small projects with total project

		costs of \$20,000 or less do not need to be presented to the commission as long as they receive the full review process. BW stated that the same review process and permitting requirements are in place for all projects, whether they need to be presented to the commission or not. The commissioners determined that navigational aids projects do not need to be presented to the commission no matter what the total project costs are. BN moved to change the language specification for small projects to include that navigation aids no longer require commission approval and to increase the total project cost cap to \$20,000. JA seconded motion. Motion carried with KD absent for the vote. The funding cap increase will go into effect on July 1, 2024. c. Alternative Public Boating Access and Waterway Protection Plans (NR 1.91(6) and NR 1.91(4)) CH stated that she has not gotten very far on this matter due to a higher priority given to addressing the current commission seat vacancy. There was a high level review of the private provider agreement form in regards to public access, which brought to the forefront that this is a much larger issue affecting many programs and the form is quite outdated. This will need to be addressed first, before tackling alternate access plans. RW proposed that the issue be kept on the agenda for every meeting until resolved as a reminder.
