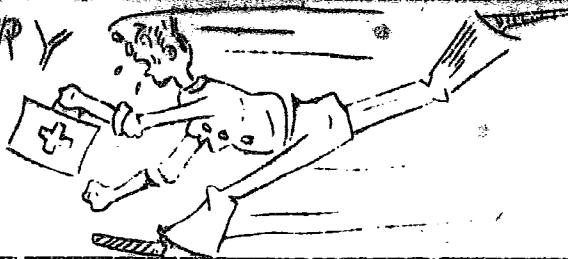


DISPENSARY NEWS
