

















# National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)

- A voluntary program based on a mutual agreement between the Federal government and the local community:
  - In exchange for adopting and enforcing floodplain management ordinances, Federally-backed flood insurance is made available to community property owners and disaster assistance.
- NFIP Goals:
- Reduce the loss of life and property caused by flooding
- Reduce rising disaster relief costs caused by flooding
- Maintain the natural and beneficial functions of the floodplains





- March 26, 2018: Discovery Meeting
- January 13, 2022: Data Development Kick-off Meeting
- Winter 2022/2023: Flood Risk Review Meetings
  - Hydraulic Modeling Completed, data made digitally available to community officials
- Future efforts (yet to be funded) would include preliminary and final countywide FIRMS



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
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
# Kickapoo Watershed Map Update

- Areas identified during Discovery & funded by FEMA will be updated. Goals are to:
  - · Updated H&H for detailed Zone AE streams
  - Updated H&H for all approximate Zone A streams
  - Keep same level of detail: areas studied using approximate methods (A zones) will remain A zones & detailed (AE zones) will remain AE zones
    - Base Flood Elevations (BFE's), or the elevation to which floodwaters are anticipated to rise during a 1% annual chance flood, will not be published if not currently shown.
  - · Share updated work map products digitally with communities
