NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETING**

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) will hold a public informational meeting to gather public input on the potential installation of a second ozone monitor in Kenosha County.

**Background**

The Chiwaukee ozone monitor (55-059-0019) is located in the southeast corner of Kenosha County near the Illinois border. The Chiwaukee ozone monitor has historically measured nonattainment for the National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ozone, including the 1979 1-hour standard, the 1997 8-hour standard, and the 2008 8-hour standard.

In April 2012, WDNR noted in a letter to Susan Hedman (USEPA) that 'The Department does not believe the Chiwaukee ozone monitor located in Kenosha County near the city of Pleasant Prairie should be used for regulatory compliance for Kenosha County.' WDNR also indicated that a location for an ozone monitor that would be more 'representative of general population exposure' may be determined.

Following the April 2012 letter from WDNR to USEPA, a portion of Kenosha County, essentially the part of the county that is east of Interstate 94, was designated nonattainment for the 2008 8-hour ozone standard.

The DNR will hold a public informational meeting to review the need for an additional possible monitoring location on:
