What data does the American Community Survey include?

The ACS is part of the decennial census and includes the same types of questions as the long form. However, the ACS is conducted every year by sending it to a rolling sample of addresses every month, and summarized in 1, 3 and 5 year increments.

1-Year Estimates	3-Year Estimates	5-Year Estimates
12 months of collected data	36 months of collected data	60 months of collected data
Data for areas with populations of 65,000+	Data for areas with populations of 20,000+	Data for all areas
