



Range of Allowable Firewood



PLEASE NOTE: Depending on the area a property covers, it is important for you to look at a map, locate your destination(s), and determine the 10-mile buffer of allowable firewood in each direction based on your unique travel plans. Example campsites and associated buffer areas are shown.

To help prevent the movement of invasive forest insects and diseases, firewood burned in Wisconsin DNR campgrounds must originate from within 10 miles of the campsite. In addition, firewood that has been harvested, purchased, stored, or moved through an Emerald Ash Borer quarantine area may not leave the quarantine area. Firewood certified by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) is allowed.
