Surprised to see this on list. (KK) Also used in cut flower arrangements. Mostly spreading in dry prairies in W WI. (7) 6-7 years in garden with no seedlings observed. Plants generally expand rhizomatically. (9) May not escape as much in WI because of climate, but climate change may increase risk.
