

## File FO 77 O (2) – Vilas County 36.86 Acres

The Department acquired this parcel in 1908 from the United States Government. There was no exchange of money for this parcel.

This parcel is located near East Hunter Lake Road in the Town of Plum Lake, approximately five miles northwest of the City of Eagle River. It was given to the State of Wisconsin to create a forest reserve. The parcel has approximately 955 feet of shoreline on Hunter Lake. This parcel has five Natural Heritage Inventory (NHI) hits, including one threatened species. It is also located within the Wisconsin River Headwaters.

Because the parcel is passively managed, the Department has not made significant investments in infrastructure or habitat improvements on the property. There is public hunting and trapping opportunities on the parcel.

There is a reversionary clause on this parcel, stating that the parcel will revert back to the United States Government if the parcel is no longer used as a forest reserve by the State of Wisconsin.

The Department recommends retaining this parcel.
