EPA Gets 30-Day Delay for Combustion Rules

The final Boiler MACT and Area Source Rules, as well as the Commercial/Industrial Solid Waste Incinerator (CISWI) Rule have been delayed 30 days. EPA had requested a delay until April 2012 or later given they received thousands of comments. These rules are going to impact just about any business with a boiler and the CISWI rule may impact those using small burn-off ovens to clean hooks/racks from paint conveyor systems. Thousands of businesses in Wisconsin will be affected.

EPA's Miscellaneous Surface Coating Rule Deadline is Here!

Don't forget to submit your Notification of Compliance Status form for the Paint Stripping and Miscellaneous Surface Coating rule, 40 CFR part 63 subpart HHHHHH. This rule affects any area source painting plastic or metal parts and that uses paints containing the target HAPs.
