The Small Business Environmental Council (SBEC) invites you to attend their next meeting on Thursday, January 23, 2014 from 9:00am-noon at the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) central office, 101 S Webster Street in Madison, room 713. Topics of discussion will include proposed rule changes for the control of invasive species as well as well driller and pump installer regulations and construction and installation requirements. The Council will also discuss major areas of non-compliance for small sources of air emissions and how DNR can better assist those sources.

The SBEC is comprised of small business and public representatives that advise the DNR and the Small Business Environmental Assistance Program (SBEAP) on how environmental regulations affect small businesses and how the SBEAP can better assist the small business community to understand and comply with the rules. The Council meets quarterly and all meetings are open to the public. To attend the meeting, please sign in at the first floor reception desk and you will be directed to the meeting room. Members of the public are welcome to attend the entire session, but public comments will be heard starting at 11:30.
