

**Purpose of Sale:**

The objective of the sale is to thin the mixed red pine and oak stand and to regenerate the oak stand.

**Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:**

1. The oak seed tree area has oak wilt restrictions, and may not be cut between April 1 and July 15<sup>th</sup>.
2. **The portion of the sale that is inside or immediately surrounding the ski trail may not be cut during winter without permission from the DNR Forester.** Trail crossings shall be kept to a minimum and smoothed out as soon as their use is completed. The asphalt parking lot cannot be used for logging operations or landing wood. Logging operations must take care not to damage the toilet building or paved parking area, and caution shall be practiced during all operations near the recreational trails.
3. Do not cut painted boundary trees. Private land borders the southern part of the sale – do not fell trees across paint lines or damage survey markers.
4. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to soil restrictions.
5. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.
6. Slash must be evenly lopped / scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Slash within 50 feet of all town roads and recreational trails must lie within 2 feet of the ground. Do not bury any pine seedlings or saplings with slash.
7. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.



**Purpose of Sale:**

To regenerate an even-aged jack pine stand. This sale is part of a jack pine natural regeneration study.

**Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:**


1. This is a LUMP SUM sale. 50% of the total bid value must be paid prior to start-up. Once 50% of the sale has been cut (as determined by the DNR Forester), the remainder of the bid value must be paid before any further cutting can continue. Pre-authorization is required for cutting any trees not designated to be cut as part of this sale. These trees must be piled separately and will be billed as an additional cost.
2. Hauling may not be done on any mill scale jobs on the Black River State Forest at the same time as on this job without pre-authorization from the DNR Forester.
3. This sale has no seasonal restrictions, and the ground is high, dry sand. The sale area has been scarified with dozers, so has uneven ground and small piles of dirt, sod and brush.
4. Pipes marking study plots are located within the sale area, but are marked for visibility. Take care not to damage these markers and to replace them if they are knocked over.
5. The sale boundaries are red paint lines and a blue line for a private property boundary. Do not fell trees across paint lines and do not cut painted boundary trees.
6. **No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale** due to tops being left for jack pine regeneration.
7. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.
8. Bunching or grapple skidding will not be allowed until trees are lopped and topped.
9. Jack pine slash must be placed on the scarified areas of the forest floor, and must lie within 18" of the ground.
10. All landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin. **There are plants growing near the sale area that need to be protected. The DNR forester will flag these areas and discuss with the contractors prior to starting the job.**

**General Requirements:**

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less. **Stumps from trees with dirt piled next to the base (from scarification), may be left higher to minimize damage to logging equipment.**
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
6. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.

This stand has been scarified with dozers and root rakes and has uneven ground and piles of dirt and brush. Stumps may be cut high if dirt has been piled up next to the tree (to prevent damage to equipment).


1. A large portion of this sale area is on low, seasonally wet ground. Dry or frozen conditions are required for operation.
2. Do not cut painted boundary trees.
3. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale in order to better regenerate jack pine and allow for equipment operation on low ground (using tops for running equipment on).
4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.
5. Slash must be evenly lopped / scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway or town road. 
1. This sale has no seasonal restrictions and is all located on high, dry ground.
2. The ATV/snowmobile trail runs through this sale and may be used for forwarding wood, but must remain in useable condition at any time that the trail is open to recreational users. Slash and debris must be cleaned off the trail daily and the trail may not be plowed to bare dirt during snowmobiling season. Due to topography, this trail may not be used for hauling.
3. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to poor soils.
4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Purpose of Sale:**

The objective of the sale is to thin the red pine stands to increase growth and vigor.

**Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:**

1. This sale has no seasonal restrictions, however, **this sale requires the Purchaser to complete Annosum root rot preventive treatment if harvesting between 4/1-11/30.** Treatment must be performed by a Certified Pesticide Applicator. Treatment involves chemically treating all fresh-cut stumps of pines of merchantable size by applying either Sporax (sodium tetraborate decahydrate) or CELLU-TREAT (disodium octaborate tetrahydrate). Treatment shall be made the same day as harvest and a dye product shall be added to liquid solutions for inspection purposes. The cost of this application can vary based on application method and harvest conditions, but should be considered when submitting bids on this timber sale.
2. There is endangered species habitat located within and near to the timber sale area that must be protected. **Contact the DNR Forester 2 days prior to starting up the sale to allow time to flag areas that must be avoided. No landing wood, parking trailers or equipment will be allowed along Stanton Creek Road.**
3. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to poor soil nutrient levels.
4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15<sup>th</sup>.
5. The ATV/snowmobile trail may be used for hauling and forwarding wood, but must remain in useable condition at any time that the trail is open to recreational users. Slash and debris must be cleaned off the trail daily and the trail may not be plowed to bare dirt during snowmobiling season.
6. Slash must be evenly lopped / scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway or town road or recreational trail. 



2. The piece of the sale located north and east of the two creeks will be accessed via a woods trail and a culvert (yet to be placed). This access will support a forwarder, but trucking will not be allowed across. This piece of the sale is approximately 23 acres.
3. Only harvest the orange marked trees, and no equipment use within 50' of the streams.
4. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to poor soils.
