Purpose of Sale:

To remove poor quality hardwoods for increased understory sunlight for regeneration promotion via even-aged management techniques, and to thin red pine to improve stand health and vigor.

Cutting Specifications: In red pine stands cut those that are marked in orange paint. In hardwood stands, cut all trees >2" DBH. Do not cut trees marked in green paint.

Special Operating Requirements and Slash Disposal:

1. Portions of this sale are located on softer ground. All stands should be harvested during dry or frozen ground conditions. Care should be taken to avoid rutting and soil compaction.
2. April 1st to Sept. 30th, pine must be hauled off site within 3 weeks of felling to minimize bark beetle populations.
3. No biomass harvesting is allowed on this sale due to poor soil fertility.
4. All pine products cut between March 1st and August 30 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed before March 15th.
5. No recreational trails run through this property, but all roads used by logging equipment should be left in good condition.
6. Slash must be evenly lopped/scattered within the sale boundary and shall be deposited a minimum of 10 feet from the mowed right-of-way of any highway, town road, or recreational trail. Do not bury seedlings or saplings with slash. Access roads to remain open.
7. This sale requires the Purchaser to complete Annosum root rot preventative treatment if harvested April 1-Nov.30. Treatment must be performed by a Certified Pesticide Applicator (proof of certification required). Treatment involves chemically treating all fresh-cut stumps of pines of merchantable size by applying either Sporax (sodium tetraborate decahydrate) or CELLU-TREAT (disodium octaborate tetrahydrate). Treatment shall be made the same day as harvest and a dye product shall be added to liquid solutions for inspection purposes. The cost of this application can vary based on application method and harvest conditions, but should be considered when submitting bids on these timber sales.
8. Area 2 sale boundary is blue paint. Do not fell trees across paint or property lines and do not cut painted boundary trees.
9. Area 1: East boundary line is red paint, to the west and north it is blue paint and field edge. Oak wilt restriction is from April 1 to July 15. No cutting within these dates. Access across private property has been verbally granted but must be verified by the landowner prior to any operations on the property. Planting of the access road may affect timing of entry.



General Requirements:

1. All designated tree species must be cut and forwarded concurrently with the sale.
2. All stumps shall be no higher than the stump diameter, or 10 inches, whichever is less.
3. Do not cut or knock down any dead or hollow trees. These are important wildlife habitat. Any that must be cut shall be left in big pieces on the forest floor.
4. Utilization: cut and use all designated trees with one or more 100" sticks to a 4" top diameter.
5. Notify the DNR forester before you start the job, and each time you pull out or return to the job.
6. Any new roads and all landings must be approved by a DNR forester before operations begin.
7. Any berms removed during harvesting operations must be put back to the satisfaction of the DNR Forester.
8. Any trees cut or pushed over for new roads or landings must be utilized or cleaned up to the DNR Forester's satisfaction.
9. **Wisconsin's Best Management Practices for Invasive Species applies – contractor must clean equipment before entering and leaving the sale area! This involves brushing away all dirt and cleaning air intakes of debris.**

Area 1: Hardwood clear cut: Cut all trees >2" dbh. Do **not** cut trees marked in green paint. This area contains a four acre **Red Pine Thinning:** Cut all trees marked in orange paint. *Sale boundaries are delineated in red paint to the east. Boundary to west is blue for private land and field edge to west and north, ending at section lines. Seasonal restrictions apply see prospectus.

Area 2: Red Pine Thinning: Cut all trees marked in orange paint. *Sale boundary is marked entirely in blue.
