





Tract (7-15) Rolling Oak Sale



Select Cut Area (30 acres) -Bounded by red and blue paint line. Harvest all orange marked trees within the designated boundaries. Sever all orange marked unmerchantable stems (canopy gaps). Cut all aspen and ironwood. Leave, do not cut 1)snags 2)cull trees 3) trees marked with an orange X.



Aspen/Spruce Area (64 acres) – Bounded by yellow and blue paint line. Cut all trees greater than 2 inches **except for:** 1)white pine, 2)oak, 3)cherry, 4)elm.

¹Mixed pulp includes 61% hard maple, 26% red maple, 8% white birch, 5% oak and a small amount of ironwood. Mixed pulp also includes 3MBF of saw timber.

Other species not mentioned will be charged at the mixed pulp price.

The performance bond will be 15% of the total sale value. Contract length is approximately two years.

SPECIAL SALE CONDITIONS:

1. Equipment use will be restricted to frozen ground conditions only between Nov. 1st and March 14th due to access of sale being through private property, half of the sale is located within the Flambeau River Scenic Management Area, and there is suitable habitat for species of special concern located within the sale area.
2. No pole length skidding will be allowed in the select cut areas.
3. Existing woods roads will be used. Improvements will need to be made on several portions of the existing road system. Decking will be permitted along woods roads.
4. No decking of wood will be allowed on the private portion of the access road unless permission is granted by private landowner.
5. Contractor is required to close road at the locations designated on the map by placing logging debris, per sale prospectus.
6. Access road through private shall be returned to "as good or better condition." Turnarounds can be constructed within the aspen areas and all wood should be decked from the sale in the turnarounds or along the woods roads on state property. No wood or logging debris will be allowed across the blue line or on the private portion of the access road.
7. New road construction is limited to proposed layout shown on prospectus map. Modifications can be made with approval from DNR Forester.
8. **All additional restrictions listed in prospectus and standard contract apply unless specified.**
