




Tract 19-15 (Big Ox Sale)




Select Cut Area (44 acres) – Bounded by red paint line. Harvest all orange marked trees within the designated boundaries. Sever all orange marked unmerchantable stems (canopy gaps). Leave, do not cut 1) snags, 2) cull trees, 3) trees marked with an orange X. Cut only **marked** aspen.




Aspen Coppice Area (50 acres) – Bounded by yellow paint line. Harvest all trees greater than 2 inches **except for:** 1) white pine, 2) red pine, 3) hemlock, 4) spruce, 5) cedar, 6) oak, 7) trees marked with a yellow X, or 8) balsam with a dbh under 6”.



Purple Area (2 acres) – Bounded by purple paint. Cut all trees greater than 1” **except for:** 1) white pine, 2) red pine, 3) hemlock, 4) oak, or 5) trees marked with a purple X. **Do not sever any aspen.**



Aspen/Hazel Area (1 acre) – Bounded by yellow paint line. Aspen is sparse and located on edge of hazel. Harvest all trees greater than 2 inches.

¹Mixed pulp includes approx. 50% of sugar maple, 36% of red maple, 8% of yellow birch, and 6% ash, white birch, cherry, elm and ironwood. Mixed pulp also includes 8 MBF of sugar maple, 2 MBF of red maple, 2 MBF of yellow birch, 1 MBF of ash, and 1 MBF of white birch. Balsam Fir² includes a small amount of spruce.

Other species not mentioned will be charged the mixed pulp price.

The performance bond will be 15% of the total sale value. Contract length is approximately two years.

SPECIAL SALE CONDITIONS:

This sale is within the Flambeau River Scenic Management Area, operations within this area shall be conducted during leaf off (October 15th – March 31st).

All wood decked within 400' of the Flambeau River must be removed prior to April 1st of each year.

Use of a continuous rotating saw head will not be allowed in the select cut area due to density and distribution of regeneration.

Existing roads will be used for back-ins and decking.

If permitted, culverts or poles may be needed in the ditches to access portions of the sale along Dix Dox Road and state forest access roads. Culvert and pole placement and removal are the responsibility of the contractor.

If decking is permitted on Dix Dox Road or the state forest access roads, all slash and ends will be removed from the roads and ditches concurrently with each truckload.

No cutting will be allowed within Purple areas until scarification is completed by the state. Harvest shall be completed within one year of scarification. Do not cut or disturb aspen.

All additional restrictions listed in prospectus and standard contract apply unless specified.
