



City of Waukesha Diversion Application – Water Conservation and Efficiency

City of Waukesha Sprinkling Ordinance
May 1st - October 1st

Odd Numbered Addresses
May water on **Tuesdays & Saturdays** prior to
9 AM or after 5 PM

Even Numbered Addresses
May water on **Thursdays & Sundays** prior to
9 AM or after 5 PM

A hand-held water can, container, or hose may be used
at any time to water gardens, trees, or shrubs, if the
device is utilized manually and not left unattended.

DNR Review Criteria

→Water Conservation and Efficiency

Waukesha's application must show:

1. The need for all or part of the proposed diversion of Great Lakes water cannot be reasonably avoided through the efficient use and conservation of existing water supplies.
2. A commitment to implementing the applicable water conservation and efficiency measures that are environmentally sound and economically feasible for the City.

**The City of Waukesha must comply with
Wisconsin Water Conservation law
(Chapter NR 852):**

1. Water Conservation plan
2. Identification and analysis of environmentally sound and economically feasible water conservation and efficiency measures
3. Implementation of Water Conservation and Efficiency Measures (CEMs)
4. Demonstrate efficient use of existing water supplies.

Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has a Water Conservation and Efficiency program that is charged with implementing Wisconsin water conservation laws and encouraging efficient water use statewide



Waukesha Water Conservation Plan

- **Key goals:**
- 10% reduction over 2009 water use
- Implement and update plan on a 5-year cycle

Water Conservation and Efficiency Measures being implemented:

- Water use audit
- Distribution system leak detection and repair
- Information and education outreach
- Outdoor water use ordinance
- Source measurement
- Distribution system pressure management
- Residential, commercial, and industrial demand management program
- Toilet rebate incentive program
- Water conservation rate structure
- Residential, commercial, and industrial water use audits
- Rebate program for water efficient fixtures and appliances
