Using the Coughlin Center as our base camp,

we'll venture out to explore Lake Winnebago's unique fishery, wade a nearby stream and spend time in the lab learning just what makes a fish a fish.

DESCRIPTION:

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has a boatload of classroom resources to help you enrich your students' studies of our lakes, streams and wetlands and the fish that call them home. Cross-disciplinary materials support Common Core Standards and Next Generation Science Standards for grades 4-12. Supplemental materials are available for teachers of younger learners.

COSTS:

\$270, including \$220 for two graduate credits from Viterbo University and a \$50 fee for Project WET and Project WILD. The non-credit cost of the workshop is \$50 for Project WET & Project WILD.
