WHEREAS; Wisconsin offers many opportunities for citizens to get involved in managing public lands, including public lands adoption programs, river cleanups, species monitoring projects, volunteering, and many more; and

WHEREAS; National Public Lands Day is the largest nationwide volunteer day for public lands and draws attention to volunteer opportunities and fosters citizen appreciation of public lands that allows current and future generations to enjoy Wisconsin's great outdoors for years to come;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the state of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim Saturday, September 24, 2016 as

PUBLIC LANDS DAY


throughout the state of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.
